Pastor's Pondering (pg 2)

GENEROSITY IN FORGIVENESS

In the early Church of the Apostle's time, the Sacrament of Reconciliation was not fully developed. Baptism was the great sacrament of God's forgiveness; all prior sins were washed away. The new Christian was then expected to live a life of holiness. In part, this was part of the reason some tried to delay their baptism until close to their deathbed, so they would go immediately to heaven. One of the challenges of the early Church was to determine how to respond to disciples who subsequently sinned. They could not be rebaptized, should they be shunned? Should they be given a certain amount of chances to make atonement?

Peter likely believes that he is being very generous. Seven represents perfection in the Hebrew Scriptures, so surely that is an acceptable amount of times to forgive. Jesus makes a powerful statement in his response to Peter. Human beings can do nothing to earn divine forgiveness. Our sin is an affront to God, and we have nothing to offer God that can make up for it. God's grace is overwhelming and total gift to us. Even the desire to ask for forgiveness is initiated by God.

The second part of Jesus' parable strikes at the core of the situation in the early Christian communities. If God is so generous in granting us forgiveness, how can we be so stingy in offering it to our brothers and sisters? Whatever another does to us pales in comparison to how our actions and non-actions rupture our relationship to God. Why then are we so quick to refuse forgiveness or to demand full satisfaction before offering forgiveness? We comprehend what Jesus is teaching when we think about a money debt. If someone writes off the one thousand dollars that we owe them, it is absurd to call the police to jail someone who owes us ten dollars. After all, we have just saved nine hundred and ninety dollars by the first action.

Somehow, it looks very different when we substitute a specific sin for money. My angry words are not as hurtful as your angry words. My lack of judgement is less significant than your honest mistake. My regular refusal to pray to God is "justified," because I am so busy; there is no excuse for you not calling or visiting. You get the idea. We almost presume God's goodness but can come up with many reasons to withhold our goodness.

Jesus does not want us to project our stinginess onto God and despair that God will not forgive us. Rather, he desires that we imitate God's example and be overwhelming in our forgiveness. As we learned in our Parish retreat this Lent, forgiveness is more than pretending to be alright with someone or something they did. Forgiveness is hard work, and it is intentional work. We cannot simply wish for it to happen. Our first step is to recognize how much God loves and forgives me. The second step is to ask this gracious God to help me develop this generous attitude towards the specific people that disappoint, hurt, and otherwise bother me.

Family Faith Formation:



24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

LET US PRAY

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

GOSPEL BACKGROUND: MATTHEW 18:21-35

Today's Gospel reading directly follows last week's Gospel in which Jesus taught the disciples how to handle disputes and conflict within the Christian community. In today's reading Peter asks Jesus how many times one ought to extend forgiveness to another. Peter proposes a reasonable number of times, perhaps seven. Jesus replies by extending Peter's proposal by an enormous amount; not just seven times should one forgive, but 77 times. The parable of the unforgiving servant is Jesus' elaboration of his initial reply to Peter. Through the parable we come to understand the depths of God's mercy toward us and the results of our acceptance of God's forgiveness.

Children learn to trust God's mercy and forgiveness when they experience forgiveness from those closest to them. We hope that we model God's love and forgiveness within our family life. Today's Gospel reminds us that forgiveness is measured by its quality more than its quantity. Invite your family to consider some recent times when family members sought the forgiveness of another. Ask if there were any statements made that put conditions on our forgiveness such as "I will play this game with you if you apologize for knocking over my blocks" or "I will accept your apology after you clean up your room." Do we sometimes "keep count" or put conditions on our forgiveness of one another? This is something we may be doing without realizing it.

FAMILY CONVERSATION:

- 1. What might we use to mend torn fabric?
- What about torn paper?
- 3. We don't just need to mend things. When we do something to harm someone, we also need to mend our relationship with that person.
- 4. How can we mend our relationship when we harm someone?
- 5. When we are sorry for having done wrong, God always forgives us. The people who love and care for us forgive us, too. When we are truly sorry, being forgiven helps us know that we are loved and that our relationships are mended.

WHAT WILL FAITH FORMATION LOOK LIKE THIS FALL?

Dear Parishioners,

Our parish clergy and staff recently made decisions regarding Fall plans for our regular Sept-May Faith Formation amidst the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. We are aware that there are still so many unknowns and questions regarding the re-opening of our local schools, other gathering places, and businesses, which present challenges and insecurities for all of us. For your planning purposes, and to ease your minds and hearts, we are keeping safety as a primary awareness as together we continue to grow our faith and come closer to God by living the good news of the Gospel. Detailed information will be sent soon to all parishioners and family learning groups. For now, a summary of what to expect:

Adult Faith Formation

 Our clergy and staff, helped by parishioners, are currently developing a model for the Fall and will communicate these decisions soon.

Faith Formation for Families, Children, and Older Youth:

- In Sept-Dec, we will NOT be physically gathering for regular Sunday Family Faith Formation sessions or week-day gatherings.
- In January, we will reassess this plan and act accordingly, with guidance by the National/Maine CDC, and Bishop Deeley.
- The week of Oct 4 marks the formal beginning of our faith formation year. Our staff and volunteer catechists will offer blended learning, including interactive virtual learning sessions twice a month with follow-up guided at-home interactive learning for weeks in between.
- In both cases (virtual and at-home), sessions will include Catholic faith teachings, conversation prompts, prayer, ritual, Bible stories, and suggestions for family activities and actions.
- Because our parish wants to maintain a strong practice of family formation, we ask parents/ guardians of children ages 3-10 to join their children for the virtual sessions. This will provide social interaction and modeling for leading the athome learning sessions.
- All virtual sessions will be co-led by staff and/ or volunteers, in compliance with diocesan and parish safe environment mandates. Our annual safe environment Circle of Grace lesson will be embedded in the month of November.

Message from Fr. Phil about this change:

We will use September to evaluate this schedule, with the hope of alternating this schedule monthly, if warranted. I wish to remind parishioners that the Obligation to Attend Sunday Mass is still suspended. Those who are currently attending masses have been able to attend fairly frequently over the past few months. Some of your brothers and sisters have said that these two masses are the only ones that they can attend. In justice, I believe it is important to respond to that request. After having gone from March 17th to June 1st with no one having the opportunity to receive Holy Communion, I hope that parishioners who are able can adjust their schedules to attend the masses they can, or that they will offer opportunity for those who have not received from March 17th to come to mass for a few weeks.

DIOCESE OF PORTLAND LAUNCHES A SPECIAL FAITHFUL CITIZENSHIP RESOURCE SECTION

To assist voters as Election Day (November 3) approaches, the Diocese of Portland has launched a special Faithful Citizenship resource section to assist visitors in the exercise of their rights and duties as participants in our democracy.

The page (www.portlanddiocese.org/faithful-citizenship) includes a variety of helpful information, including Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship in English and Spanish. Prepared by the Catholic bishops of the United States, the teaching document aims to help Catholics understand their political responsibility, contribute to civil and respectful public dialogue, and shape political choices in light of Catholic teaching.

While Catholics are encouraged to vote, the Catholic Church does not tell them for whom to vote, nor does it endorse candidates. Instead, the Church helps Catholics "form their consciences in accordance with God's truth." The bishops state, "We recognize that the responsibility to make choices in political life rests with each individual in light of a properly formed conscience, and that participation goes well beyond casting a vote in a particular election."

The section also features Bishop Robert Deeley's recent reflection on faithful citizenship that appears in the September/ October 2020 issue of Harvest, the official magazine of the Diocese of Portland.

"The Church affirms that every Catholic is called to prayerful, active, and responsible participation in the political process," said Bishop Deeley. "As such, I urge all of us, who are eligible, to register and vote. In voting, then, in fulfilling our faithful citizenship, we, indeed, carry the cross, because we live out the call to holiness and work with Christ as he builds his kingdom of love."
