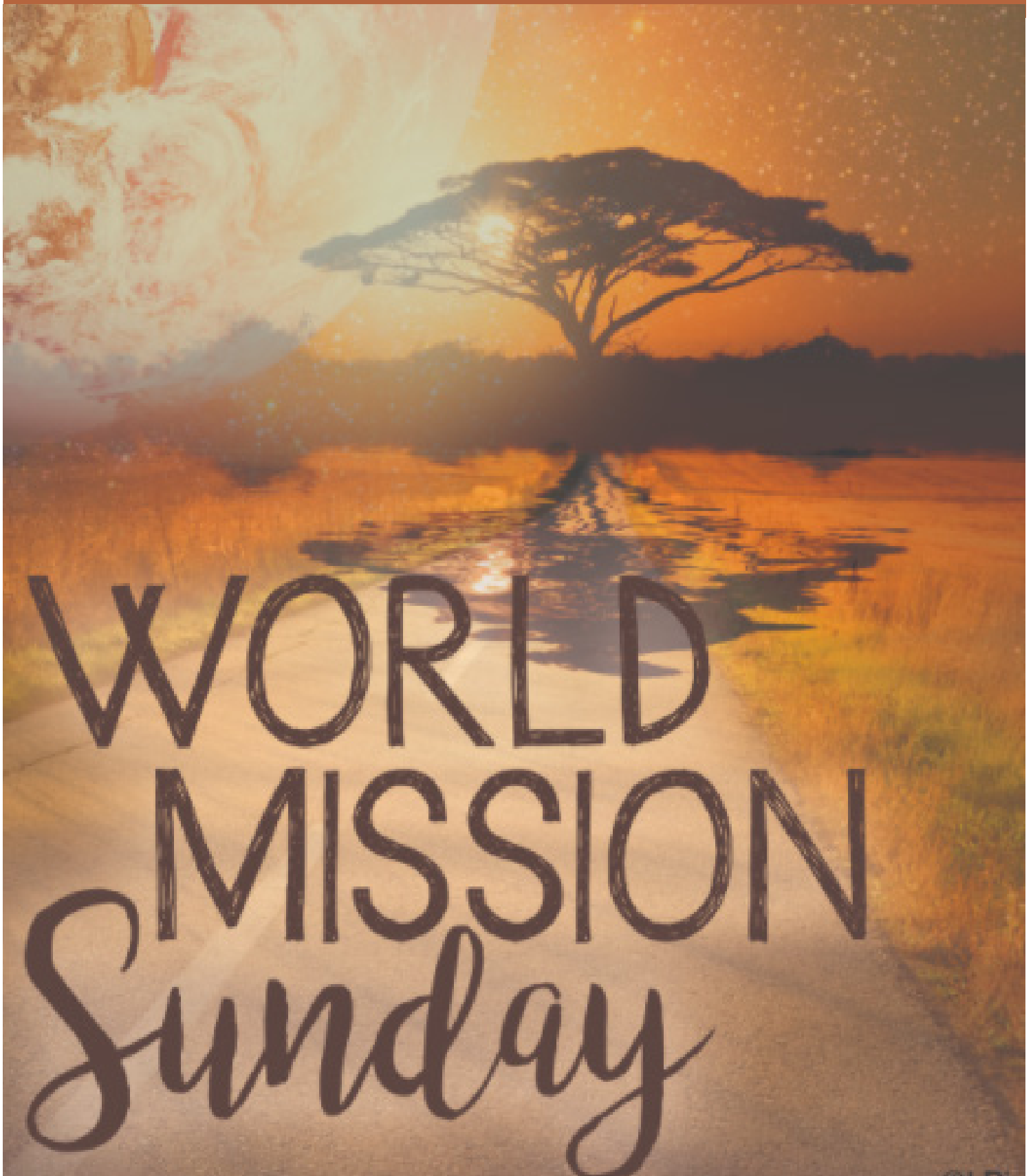

## WHAT GOOD IS IT TO INHERIT THE WORLD IF ONE LOSES THEIR SALVATION?



In the movies, the hero or heroine often faces a "no win situation." Either they rescue their friend and let the villain escape, or they chase the villain and their friend dies. If they do what justice demands, they also risk revealing their secret identity, or some indiscretion of their past. If they turn a blind eye to justice, they can walk away with their identity and reputation intact. Of course, in the movies, sometimes the protagonist can change the conditions of the situation so radically that a solution is possible.

We often face similar situations in our own lives. Do I tell the truth and face consequences, or do I lie, or at least, omit important facts, and walk away unscathed? Do I help a loved one and risk their ire at interfering, or do I not act, and watch the loved one suffer needlessly? Often times we do not have a great deal of time to make a decision. At these times we have to do our best to determine the greater of two goods, or the lesser of two evils. Cultivating virtue helps this process. We come to understand and practice that the good of the other is more essential than a punishment or consequence that I clearly deserve.

More troubling is when you or I are the persons that place another in a "no win situation", as the religious leaders do to Jesus in this week's Gospel. They cannot explain his mighty works. They cannot argue against the power of his teaching. Therefore, they try to discredit him, either in the eyes of the Romans or his fellow Jews. Families and friendships are being torn apart over the upcoming elections. Every day people are being challenged: if you truly love me, if you want to keep your job, if you... then you will do this something that you believe is wrong. Unlike the movies, we cannot simply change the conditions to create a solution.

Instead, we are asked to follow the example of Jesus. He acknowledges that the government of the day has a rightful claim to concessions and actions. However, God also has a claim on our lives. I can be a good citizen and a person of faith. When those claims conflict with each other, God has the greater claim to our allegiance. As Jesus says elsewhere, what good is it to inherit the world if one loses their salvation?

Do we really want to lose a valued relationship over an election? Neither party is more in tune with Gospel values than the other. Few candidates in history have ever delivered on what they promised on campaigns. You have to weigh the issues for yourselves and make your best choice, realizing that equally intelligent and religious people may make a different choice. Perhaps keeping the relationship as a priority will bring greater understanding to both of you. If you have to prove your love or work ethic by doing something you believe is wrong, do you honestly think that there will ever be enough proof? Comprehending that such 'love' is not the virtue that God intended for you, or that such a work environment is toxic to your spiritual health may seem like failure, but ultimately, it will be freeing. We are wrong to ask people to make some of the choices that we ask them to make. Like the religious leaders of Jesus time, we would be better served to understand what the real issues are that we struggle with, and ask for God's help to discern the path I am to follow, instead of trying to restrict the path someone else is to travel.

#### GOSPEL BACKGROUND MATTHEW 22: 15-21

The Pharisees want to trap Jesus into taking sides about paying Roman taxes. They believe that accepting Roman rule in their country means they are not loyal to God's laws. If Jesus takes sides, he may get into trouble with the Roman leaders. Jesus tells them to obey both the laws of the land as citizens but also to obey the laws of God.

The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech. They sent their disciples to him, with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth.

And you are not concerned with anyone's opinion, for you do not regard a person's status. Tell us, then, what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Knowing their malice, Jesus said, "Why are you testing me, you hypocrites? Show me the coin that pays the census tax." Then they handed him the Roman coin. He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" They replied, "Caesar's."

At that he said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

#### FAMILY CONVERSATION

Do I follow God's commandments because I am afraid of Him or because I love Him? What's the difference?

Why do families, states, and countries have rules and laws?

Are God's laws greater than human laws?

We will pick one of the 10 commandments to think about this week.

We will say a prayer to help us practice that commandment.

### ALL SOULS

November is a month in which Catholics traditionally pray for their departed loved ones. We believe that our prayers and sacrifices on behalf of the dead in purgatory can assist them in their purification. Such prayer also reminds us that our ultimate destination is heaven, and that we should live lives that bring us closer to that reality.

In the past, we have placed All Souls envelopes for parishioners to list loved ones to be prayed for. We would then divide the donation in the envelope by ten and determine how many individual masses could be said for those intentions. There are several limitations with this process. Many participants did not intend for an individual mass to be said. The number of envelopes creates too many masses for us to say in the parish in a given year with all the other requests for masses we receive. Finally, not every donation was divisible by ten, which creates problems with our bookkeeping.

This year, we are doing something different. The envelopes for All Souls that are collected will be divided, and placed on the four church altars. During the month of November, at all masses, the priest will be praying for the intentions of the names submitted for the parish, not simply the envelopes on that altar. All the donations will be used for liturgical needs: repair of vessels and vestments, new altar clothes and other appointments, etc. If you desire a mass to be said specifically for your deceased loved ones, please use the forms at the entrances of the Church or contact Kim Palli in the office. 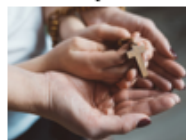

For each day, reflect on the quote from Pope Francis, pray a decade of the rosary and conclude with St. John Paul II's prayer.

- 1 Even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation ...
- 2 "Human life is sacred and inviolable, and the use of prenatal diagnosis for selective purposes must be strongly discouraged."
- 3 It is God who gives life. Let us respect and love human life, especially vulnerable life in a mother's womb."
- 4 "Every child who, rather than being born, is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ ..."
- 5 "The Church cannot be expected to change her position on this question. ... It is not 'progressive' to try to resolve problems by eliminating a human life."
- 6 "Our defense of the innocent unborn ... needs to be clear, firm and passionate, for at stake is the dignity of a human life ..."
- 7 "Equally sacred ... are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the undersheltered, the vulnerable infirm and elderly ..."
- 8 All too often ... people do not accept the 'Gospel of Life' but let themselves be led by ideologies and ways of thinking that block life, that do not respect life ..."
- 9 "Unborn children are always to be welcomed; life is always to be protected and loved, from conception to its natural end."

## ITALIAN TEEN BEATIFIED

An Italian teenager who used the internet to spread his faith is on a path to becoming the Catholic Church's first millennial saint.

Carlo Acutis, who died of leukaemia in 2006 aged 15, has already been dubbed "the patron saint of the internet".

On Saturday, he was beatified at a ceremony in the town of Assisi and moved one step closer to sainthood.

The teenager recorded purported miracles online and helped run websites for Catholic organisations.

Acutis was placed on the path to sainthood after the Vatican ruled he had miraculously saved another boy's life.

The Church claimed he interceded from heaven in 2013 to cure a Brazilian boy who was suffering from a rare pancreatic disease.

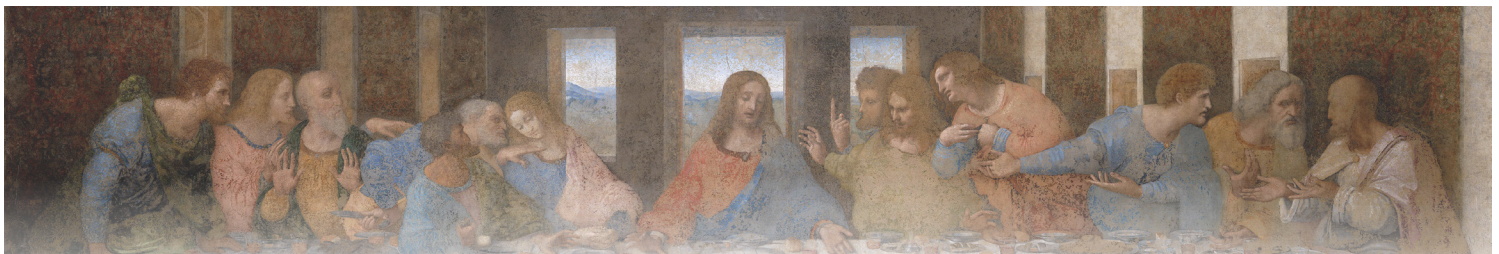
