

Pastor's Pondering (pg 2)

HOPE & PATIENCE

After gathering to give personal and communal thanks for everything that God has blessed us with on Thursday, we now begin the process of asking for all the things that we want for Christmas! As a child I remember the seeming magic of being surprised on Christmas morning. Our family was not big into writing letters to Santa or making long wish lists. These days, Christmas morning is more like a wedding registry. One knows already what they will be receiving.

The season of Advent reminds us that the one thing and only thing that we truly need is to be saved. We must be in right relationship with God. This means that we recognize and respond to his presence on earth, and we prepare ourselves to be worthy to live with him in eternity. The readings, music and prayers of our liturgies prepare us for the end times of final judgement, and then the gift of God's love in the Incarnation, Jesus being born into our humanity. We are asked to keep those two spiritual "poles" in tension. Salvation is much more than simply acting kindly; we need to grow in love for God. To love Jesus is more than intellectually accepting some teachings; we must change our lives to be like him so we can be with him forever. Without this balance, we easily lose direction and purpose in life.

Hope and patience are the two virtues that define Advent. The Chosen people of Israel wait thousands of years for the promises of God to be fulfilled. They are faced with living in a desert and told it will become a fruitful land. They experience invasion and exile and believe that they have not been abandoned by God. If they lacked hope in the promises of God, their resulting impatience would have led them to embrace pagan ways. If they did not exercise patience and demanded immediate answers from God, God's seeming silence would have erased their will to hope.

This is a good rule of thumb for all of us. What precisely is my hope in the things of God? Both short term and as a goal for life, it is important that we can clearly identify what we desire from God's blessings. Vague ideals will not motivate us or give us clear direction in our lives. What precisely feeds my sense for a sense of patience? The Israelites could point to specific points in history of God's faithfulness, can you? Hope and patience are also not for the weak. We need to hope large and be heroic in remaining steadfast in patience. The Birth of Jesus is the validation that these virtues are valuable and the assurance that we will be given the blessings to achieve them.

As we begin our Advent journey, we will be tempted to focus on December 25th as an end date to achieve a long list of activities. We likely cannot avoid this, even in time of pandemic. Instead, let us take some moments, especially in our prayer and participation in the masses, to seek and celebrate the presence of hope and patience in our lives.

GOSPEL BACKGROUND

On this Sunday, the Catholic Church begins the season of preparing for the feast of Christmas, the celebration of God becoming human. It is also the season when we think of preparing for Jesus' coming in glory at the end of time. In this week's Gospel, Jesus uses an experience in the lives of his listeners similar to the experience of children or teens scrambling to finish chores before their parents get home from an event

MARK 13: 33-37

Jesus said to his disciples: "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. It is like a man traveling abroad. He leaves home and places his servants in charge, each with his own work, and orders the gatekeeper to be on the watch. Watch, therefore; you do not know when the Lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or in the morning. May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to all: 'Watch!'


