

Pastor's Pondering (pg 2)

WE NEED TO TURN TO PRAYER

I remember being greatly confused when I first paid attention to this Gospel passage. How could the person who admonished you and me to turn the other cheek, forgive others seventy times seven and pick up our crosses to follow Him justify this outburst in the temple? Jesus seems angry, but isn't anger a sin?



I now see that Jesus is being more prophetic than lashing out in anger. Anger is an emotion, and how it is expressed determines whether sin is present or not. The holiness of the temple and the purpose of temple sacrifice has been sullied. Merchants are more concerned about making a profit than helping pilgrims worship God and atone for sin. Jesus is upset, but He does not beat the merchants or destroy their property. He makes a dramatic gesture to show how incongruous this scene is in the temple of God, and what He will have to offer in response. His response is really an act of love. He wants the people to see the truth, not simply be punished.

You and I turn the other cheek and offer forgiveness to others to fulfill the command to love. There is a difference between pulling a child's arm violently because they spilled their milk and doing the same action to pull them away from a speeding vehicle. Our challenge is to recognize what concerns and upsets us in life and determining a godly response.

Sometimes this means that we need to evaluate our responses. We are all afraid and often angry when a motorist cuts us off or otherwise creates a dangerous situation. We might honk our horns or use bad words and gestures in the heat of the moment. However, if we proceed to drive aggressively to retaliate, we are not loving. Love dictates we do not escalate the situation. Sometimes we need to explain why we acted as we did. In the example above, we may need to tell a child that we were afraid for their safety, and that is why we yelled and pulled their arm so hard.

It is not easy to be prophetic these days. If we respond strongly to the presence of evil and sin, we risk being labeled "dogmatic," "intolerant" or worse. If we mind our own business, we risk giving tacit permission for such behavior and attitudes, and watering down the message of Jesus. We need to turn to prayer in all things. We need to have meaningful conversations to explore our feelings and options of response. Above all, we must always understand that our ultimate intention is to love, to help another turn away from evil and sin, not simply to punish the person and to justify it by faith.

Jesus drives out the merchants and moneychangers from the Temple courtyard! He is very angry that they are turning that sacred place of worship into a marketplace. Jesus teaches us that we are temples where God lives.

GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN 2: 13-25

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves He said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But He was speaking about the temple of His body. Therefore, when He was raised from the dead, His disciples remembered that He had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While He was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in His name when they saw the signs He was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because He knew them all and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well. human nature. He himself understood it well.
