RADICAL HOLINESS!!

This weekend we hear the conclusion of the story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus. After encountering the Risen Jesus, they immediately travel the seven miles back to Jerusalem, in the dark, to announce the Good News. Even though by this time Jesus has now appeared three or four times to His disciples, His entrance into the room is met with confusion and terror.



Certainly, part of this involves the strangeness of meeting someone whom you saw die a horrible death a few days ago. Another part of this is having our expectations meet reality. Someone can describe how immense the Grand Canyon is, how loud a jet taking off sounds, and any number of other realities, but until we experience them for ourselves, we are simply not prepared for the encounter. However, perhaps the greater challenge is that the Apostles are stuck in their human perceptions. They were used to being with Jesus as another human companion, albeit one with extraordinary abilities. Now they are meeting with the Son of God, the second person in the Blessed Trinity.


The Church always strives to find a balance with this reality. At times, the Church has emphasized the majesty and otherness (transcendence) of God. This has led some to be fearful to approach Him. At other times, the Church has emphasized the humanity and closeness (immanence) of God. This has led others to presume God's goodness or to see Jesus just as a more perfect person like themselves. God wants us to always approach him. To approach God is to place ourselves in radical holiness. We should be concerned about our lingering sinfulness; about the times we do not make time for God in our lives.

Jesus reassures His frightened Apostles in three ways. First, He invites them to come closer, to see Him as He is. Jesus desires a personal relationship with us. This is more than knowing many things about Jesus and His Church. This is more than talking God but not waiting for His reply, or doing things in the name of Jesus without evaluating whether we are accomplishing our intention.

Secondly, Jesus shares a meal with His Apostles. We see this not only as a way of proving that He is not a ghost, but as an invitation to Eucharist. The Mass must be at the center of our lives as Catholics. When the Mass is simply one more thing to fit into our busy lives, we are going to choose other activities at some point. Worse, we may attend Mass, but have our minds on the next activity to run off to do, or be resentful that we are "missing out" on something because we are at Mass.

Thirdly, Jesus explains the Scriptures again to His Apostles, helping them to comprehend God's vision of salvation history. There are times when something that seems completely new is something that has happened frequently in history. There are times when we are so close to individual moments that we fail to recognize a pattern or to make certain associations. We do not have to memorize a pattern of to make be effective disciples, but we should have a deeper understanding of what Jesus says and does and how that flows from the events and teachings of the Patriarchs, prophets and other evangelists in the New Covenant. If we commit to accepting these three activities in our own lives, we will be less afraid and more aware of what Jesus is revealing to each of us. -- Father Phil

We are beginning to look for opportunities to welcome back the ministries of Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, and Altar Servers. We may not utilize them at all masses. GOSPEL BACKGROUND

The risen Jesus appears to His friends with a message of peace and forgiveness. It is a sign of Jesus' tenderness and love for them and for us. His Resurrection is what brings us to life, now and forever. Jesus is with us, always!

GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN 24 :35 - 48

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread. While they were still speaking about this, He stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then He said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at My hands and My feet, that it is I, Myself. Touch Me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as He said this, He showed them His hands and His feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, He asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave Him a piece of baked fish; He took it and ate it in front of them. He said to them, "These are My words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about Me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." Then He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And He said to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in His name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

If our family had Jesus over for dinner, what would we talk about? Think about special meals you've had with other special people. What was that like?

Make a commitment as a family to sit down together at least once a week with no TV, phones, or other distraction and say a blessing together before you eat.

At the beginning of Lent, we advertised for volunteers to reach out to our parishioners to do wellness checks, to let our parishioners know that we were thinking of them during this period of uncertainty, provide information about Lent, how to watch Livestreamed Mass, and to ensure that they did not have any unmet needs.


We recruited 19 volunteers from all four of our churches. Wow!! These fabulous volunteers reached out to 830 parishioners by telephone or email. They had 1:1 conversations with 166 parishioners and 197 parishioners who were contacted had disconnected phones and/or no email address on file. Our volunteers left voicemail messages and sent emails to 467 parishioners in which they did not receive a response.
