**HOW AM I LOVING GOD?**

Many of us spend a great deal of time compiling lists.

We make a list before shopping, to ensure we do not forget something essential or become overly tempted to impulse buy. We make a list of activities to accomplish, so that we can prioritize them to best use our time and resources. We have contact lists in our phone that we update regularly. We rate our favorite books and movies, places that we have vacationed and restaurants that we have enjoyed in order to share with others. Sometimes our lists are predictable and static, and other times, the list is frequently amended and reorganized.



When Jesus is asked about the greatest commandment, He is mindful of two potential traps. The Pharisee might be simply looking to argue and discredit Jesus. Whatever answer Jesus gives, He will build an argument why another choice is better and more orthodox. On the other hand, the Pharisee might simply be looking to be a minimalist. Instead of trying to balance how to follow 613 laws and commandments, he will simply focus on the important one. The response of Jesus sheds insight into His fundamental teaching.

God is love. Love permeates everything about God, especially His creation. Since we are created in love, then loving God with all our heart, mind, soul, and strength is the only option for us to fulfill our nature, to be the people God created us to be. The love of God cannot be one thing among many that we seek to do. Even to place God at the top of the list is not enough. Our love of our neighbor is an extension of what absolute love for God entails, not simply putting two commandments together. The presence of God in us is reaching out God's presence in the other.

Many of us struggle with the belief that we are not putting God first in our lives or making enough time for God. In part, this is because we have our lists of things to accomplish and can only juggle so many items under our direct control. While it is absolutely necessary to create intentional time to be with God and attentive to the things of God, perhaps our unrest is that we are in that list mentality. A more useful question becomes, how am I loving God in whatever it is that I am doing, thinking, or saying? Framed this way, I am not making "more time" for God as much as I am bringing awareness of God into my life. By responding intentionally to God's presence in others, I am avoiding the tendency to see love of God as a private activity in Church or at prayer time.

## 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

### LET US PRAY

O my God, I love You above all things with my whole heart and soul, because you are all good and worthy of all my love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of You. I forgive all who have injured me and I ask pardon of those whom I have injured.  
Amen.

### GOSPEL BACKGROUND

As Christians, our moral behavior is guided by the two-part commandment taught by Jesus in today's Gospel: love God and love your neighbor as yourself. Many of us learned to use this framework as an examination of conscience. By examining our lives through the lens of these commandments, we have learned that the challenge of these commandments is not in our desire to follow them but in our capacity to consistently honor these commandments in our daily lives.

### GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK 12: 28-34

One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to Him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than He.' And 'to love Him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask Him any more questions.

### FAMILY CONVERSATIONS

For one week, identify and collect news reports of how Christians show their love for God by loving and serving their neighbor. Clip these news items and share what you have heard when you gather as a family. Talk about ways in which your family might contribute to the examples of Christian service you found. Choose one of these actions to do together as a family. Conclude in prayer together asking God to help us show love to our family members and friends.




