



From Deacon Dennis

Thank You! to Fr. Cartwright for providing me this opportunity to address any rumors that may be circulating and to clarify my status in the parish. After several months of discernment and conversations with our former pastor, Fr. Tracy, our current pastor, Fr. Cartwright, Deacon Peter Bernier and others, I have submitted my letter to Bishop Deeley requesting him to grant me the status



as a Senior Deacon, beginning July 1st of this year. This means that I will no longer have administrative duties or responsibilities to the parish, but will still be a deacon who will continue to serve in the parish for liturgical functions (i.e. still preach the homily once a monthrotating with the priests; assist at the altar mostly at St. Gregory the Great in Gray; be responsible for intake, processing, scheduling, and preparing parents for celebrating Baptisms and making sure they are recorded in the Baptismal Register)

Because I am stepping down from most administrative duties, there will be an informal gathering of staff to mark this departure. However, since I will be celebrating my 25th Anniversary of Ordination to the Permanent Diaconate on June 14, 2023, there will be a larger, parish event planned for that occasion. For twenty-four years, it has been an honor and privilege to have served the four churches, that now comprise the one Parish of the Holy Eucharist. I look forward to continuing those relationships with the many families that I have come to know and cherish.

Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

The Fire of God's Love

All of you reading this column will have heard at some point that God loves you. Some of you will have heard it more than you'd care to. There is a way in which this phrase is used that makes God sound like an oversized Barney the Purple Dinosaur in the sky. To those with that concern, I sympathize. However, until you understand that God loves you (and understand this properly), much of the Christian life won't make much sense.

Why is that? To a non-believer there are aspects of the Christian life that seem silly at best. Why believe whatever God tells you? You would never put that level of trust in a human being, so why do it with God? Why are there people who are so eager to sacrifice their time, their comfort or even their lives for God? Isn't religion all about helping you find fulfillment? Why then this emphasis on sacrifice? And what makes Christians think God is so great when all He does is make rules and judge them on it?

The answer? God loves me infinitely and I know that for a fact. Therefore, I can trust Him to tell me the truth and I can believe what He says. He's not trying to deceive me, He only wants my good. Because He loves me, I can trust that what He asks is for my true good and the good of my neighbor, even if it seems hard. Further, He loved me so much that He gave His life for me on the cross. He gave everything for love of me, and it is only natural that I should want to give everything for love of Him, even if it hurts. Sacrifices become a joy when done out of love.

In 1673, Jesus showed St. Margaret Mary His Heart. She reports that it was a veritable furnace, on fire with love for us. The love of God is not something



sentimental or wimpy: it is a fire of love that burns so hot that it consumes Him, that drives Him to sacrifice everything for love of us, even to the point of dying on the cross. You'll notice that several of our catechetical programs follow this theme: Spark, Flame, FIRE. We did this for a reason. It is more than just a hope that our children will be zealous and on fire for the faith. We hope they too will come to know the fire that burns in the heart of Jesus for them and their hearts will be set ablaze by it. Once you know the fire of God's love, the Christian life will make sense, with all its sacrifices and seeming eccentricities.


