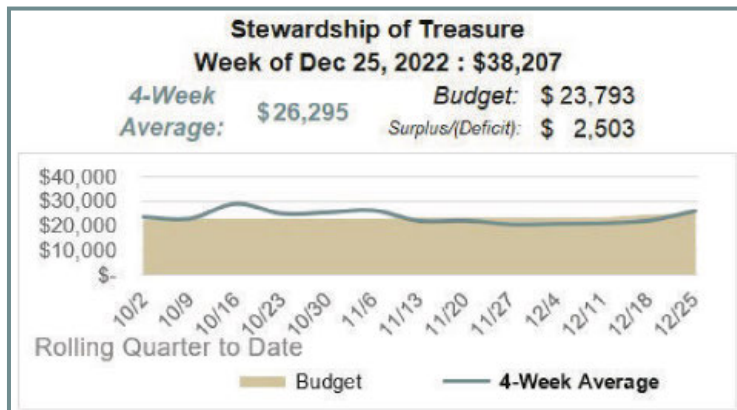

Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

A Retreat for Catholics in their 20s and 30s

One of the fun parts of my job is my work with Casco Bay Catholics. Casco Bay Catholics is a young adult ministry that started in Portland a little over a year ago. There are currently over 75 young adults (ages 18 to roughly 35) who are involved in some capacity.

As you can imagine, in a world where most millennials and Gen Zs are hostile to religion, finding a sizeable group of young adults who not only share your faith but care about it and practice it is a big deal. In class or at work many of the young adults feel like they're the lone Catholics left standing in a world that has declared God dead. What a contrast when you then walk into the Cathedral on a Wednesday night and find over a dozen of your friends there for Adoration, Confession, and the Wednesday night men's group.

One of the upcoming events that I'm most excited about is the annual young adult retreat at Marie Joseph. The retreat was held for the first time last year. I can't speak from personal experience, but from what I'm told the retreat filled up and the friendships formed on the retreat were the catalyst for many of the other young adult events that sprung up over the course of the next year.

So we're doing it again. Those who went last year are invited back. Those who are just hearing about Casco Bay Catholics should think about coming. It will be a great weekend and you'll get to know a lot of good people. We've set it up as a weekend retreat (Friday through Sunday), but if you want to just commute in on Saturday, you're welcome to. We have a lower rate for that option.



The theme of this year's retreat centers around St. John the Apostle. The talks and meditations will help us know Christ better by looking through the eyes of St. John. It will be semi-silent. There will be 2-3 prayer periods of silent meditation each day, plus grand silence after night prayer through breakfast. There will be plenty of opportunity to rest with Our Lord and plenty of time in between to spend time with each other if you so wish.

Of course, the location is worth mentioning. Marie-Joseph Spiritual Center is an old hotel turned into a retreat center by the Sisters of the Presentation of Mary. It's right on the beach and even in the winter (in some ways, especially in the winter), it's a wonderful place to make a retreat. I have fond memories of walking the beach in January on a diocesan vocations retreat, the sun shining, waves crashing, and everything totally still (because who goes to the beach in January?). It's a wonderful place to step away from the noise of life and be with God.
