

# Called to Discipleship ~ Through Stewardship and Service

## PASTOR'S PONDEROSA

### Lenten Lassoing



My dear parishioners,

Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. The priests' purple vestments reflect the nature of this penitential season. The sanctuary is also quite bare. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

#### SACRED MUSIC

Lent is also a period where we see even the sacred music of the Church change to a simpler, less adorned style. To this end there will be more silence in the liturgy than usual, and the instruments will be used only in support of the singing, as directed by the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM). Anyone can purchase this book. In fact, [Amazon carries the GIRM](#) and can be found by searching the title or clicking the hyperlink. The GIRM includes 399 paragraphs or sections that give instruction on how to use the Roman Missal, which is the guide for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The paragraphs are focused on the role of the priest, servers, choir, and people. There are also paragraphs on the order of the Mass. If the priest, servers, and choir do their parts correctly and reverently, the people will follow their lead. The people see and hear what the priests, servers, and choir do and therefore the priest, servers, and choir are the example.

Within the season of Lent, paragraph #313 of the GIRM reminds the liturgical music ministers of the following: "In Lent the playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only in order to give necessary support to the singing, in order that the penitential character of the season be preserved. Exceptions, however, are Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities, and Feasts."

To this end, we will begin to sing the simpler Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) in Latin and the Holy, Holy, Holy (Sanctus) in either English or Latin, both of which come from the simple Chant Mass in our Breaking Bread hymnal. The Kyrie will also be sung throughout the entire season. The Gloria will not be sung so that we may more greatly anticipate its return at the Mass of the Lord's Supper. No Alleluias in either hymns or the Gospel Acclamation, again representing a fast from our use of them throughout the rest of the year. The Our Father will continue to be recited. At some masses, there will not be a recessional hymn. Entrance and Communion antiphons, if employed, will be mostly a cappella. The 4th Sunday of Lent, known as Laetare Sunday, will be an exception to the sparseness, a day of celebration where livelier music and decorations at the altar will indicate we have passed the halfway point of Lent and are nearing Easter Sunday.

#### CHANGE IN THE RITE OF PENANCE

Since 2001, the Holy See has been supervising the gradual re-translation of all the liturgical books from the original Latin into the various vernacular languages. For example, you may remember that the revised English edition of the Roman Missal appeared in 2011. Recently, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments confirmed a revised English translation of the Order of Penance.

This new translation may be used beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023. However, the new translation **must** be used beginning on Sunday, April 16, 2023, Divine Mercy Sunday.

*Please note that Fr. Peter, Fr. Paul, and I have all begun using the new translation in the Parish of the Holy Eucharist.*



The new translation of the formula of absolution, with underlined changes, is as follows:

God the Father of mercies,  
Through the Death and Resurrection of his Son  
Has reconciled the world to Himself  
And poured out the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins;  
Through the ministry of the Church may God grant you pardon and peace.  
AND I ABSOLVE YOU FROM YOUR SINS, IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON,  
+ AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT.

May this season of simplicity and penance bear much fruit for us all.

## FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

### Being a Partner in Someone Else's Crime

Imagine this scenario: Robin Banks and Ima Crook walk into a bar and start up a friendly conversation. Robin starts to talk about how the bank robbing business has been rough lately. Security systems aren't what they used to be and finding good help in today's economy is tough. Ima (who works as a teller at the local bank) sympathizes. "You know, the security system where I work has been a bit glitchy lately. Why not try there?" Robin perks up; Ima can see that she has clearly cheered up her friend. A week later, Robin robs the bank.



The question: who needs go to Confession and what do they need to confess?

Robin's case is straightforward. The seventh commandment is, "Thou shalt not steal." By breaking into a bank and walking off with money that didn't belong to him, Robin committed theft. Therefore, he needs to be sorry for having stolen, resolve to never do it again, and bring it to Confession if he wants to be right with God.

But what about Ima? She's not the one who walked off with money that wasn't hers. Does she need to go to Confession?

The short answer is yes. By counseling Robin to rob the bank, Ima shares some part of the responsibility for it. It's not the same as robbing the bank herself, but it is wrong. We call this being accessory to another's sin.

In Catholic moral theology, there are nine ways of being accessory to another's sin: by counsel, by command, by consent, by provocation, by praise/flattery, by concealment, by partaking, by silence, and by defense of the ill done. Over the next few weeks, I want to talk about these ways of being accessory to sin. Many of the thorniest questions people get involved in are not so much about a direct violation of the commandments, but about whether or not they're responsible for helping someone else violate the commandments. My hope is that this brings peace and clarity to those who are in the throes of these questions as well as shed some light on why certain issues are so controversial today.


## MOTHER TERESA—A SIGN OF CONTRADICTION:




