





FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

Swimming and the Spiritual Life: Embrace the Cross

The third lesson swimming taught me about the spiritual life: sometimes it's supposed to hurt.

I remember when I first started swimming. I was eight years old and had taken swim lessons. In swim lessons, the goal is just to teach you how to swim, not to build up your stamina. It's different on a swim team, but I didn't know that. I remember the first practice I had, where I came home really tired. I complained to my dad, "Practice was really hard today," to which he responded, "It's supposed to be. That's how you build up your muscles and get faster." That concept hadn't occurred to me, and I wasn't sure I liked it.

In time, there was a certain degree of work and feeling tired



that I had come to accept as part of the sport, but there were limits. When I started swimming longer events like the 500 freestyle (about a 5-6 minute race), everyone was always talking about pacing. "You can't go out too fast or you'll be too

tired to finish. You have to hold back a little." In principle, that's good advice, but I took full advantage. I'd come to the end of the 500 not quite fresh as a daisy, but not spent either.

I don't remember the particulars of the race, but there was one day where I decided to go for broke. I went out fast and just tried to keep the pace up. I was in so much pain through most of that event; my arms were burning, my chest was heaving, but I was determined to keep plowing through. Unsurprisingly, I shattered my previous best time.

I realized then that being willing to dig in until it hurts is what separates the top tier from the middle tier. Until that point, I had the attitude that it wasn't supposed to hurt. Once I accepted that, I grew as a swimmer by leaps and bounds.

The same is true of the spiritual life. Great joy can be found in loving Our Lord and being loved by Him. When I was first starting to pray and live the faith in earnest, that joy was what I was focused on. But as Mother Teresa puts it, real love is love that costs us. We should love until it hurts. Just as realizing in the world of swimming that sometimes it should hurt and require me to dig deep, the same is true of the spiritual life. Living a devout life means being prepared to dig deep for God, to give until it hurts the way He gave to you on the Cross. A whole new world opens up for you when you're willing to embrace the Cross and realize that the goal is not to live in heaven on earth; it's to fight under Our Lord's banner here in order to gain the eternal reward later.
