## Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

## FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

## **Checking Your Work**

"We now return to our regularly scheduled programming..."

Prior to the lead up to Corpus Christi, we were discussing some tips for engaging discussions and disagreement. This week we'll talk about the importance of checking your work. When engaged in a deep discussion, it is easy to get lost in the world of ideas. I remember in college making sweeping claims about human nature, the course of history, and political ideals. We would have late night discussions about whether or not history moves in a particular direction, whether every human being knows good or evil by nature, or



about what a truly just society would look like. Many of these conversations had to do with patterns and principles rather than particulars. We would string together long logical syllogisms that would tie a list of abstract principles to

get a frequently counter-intuitive conclusion. We thought we were brilliant. Fortunately for my academic career and my own sanity (if we're being frank), Fr. Koterski popped my bubble early on. We were given the chance to do some armchair philosophy during his philosophy of the human person class. I wrote a paper in which I expounded on how human reason cannot be explained from purely material causes and then, based on the fact that we must posit an immaterial principle in human nature, waxed eloquent on the nature of immateriality and how it necessarily leads to the conclusion that human beings have an immortal soul. I made up all sorts of words in the paper to describe what I intended to say. There were terms like, "immaterialness" thrown around that I thought were brilliant innovations. By contrast, Fr. Koterski didn't think I was saying much of anything and once he pointed it out, I couldn't help but agree. When you get into deep discussions, it helps to ground yourself occasionally, lest you get lost in the world of ideas. If you're using a principle, try to think of two or more examples in which you can confirm that that principle actually works. For instance, if you wanted to hold that America is by nature anti-Catholic and your only example is that your neighborhood friend said something mean to you as a kid, you don't have enough to build a principle on. Likewise, consider counter examples to your rule. If you say, "History is constantly progressing," consider examples in which it seemed to change course, or when it took a serious negative turn. Perhaps you can answer those counter examples, but if you can't, it's worth considering that maybe the rule you established doesn't hold.

That's why it's important to check your work: if you don't, you can build a grand and sophisticated sounding system, and make bold claims, none of which are real. We'll examine a particular case of that next week.
