



#### FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

#### Some Final Tips for Engaging in a Discussion

With our series on engaging discussion coming to a close, I wanted to conclude with a few last tips.

First, if people are willing to be generous to you in a discussion, be generous to them in return. Seizing on petty points can stunt a conversation on both sides. The pleasant back and forth conversations require a sort of mutual agreement to disarmament. If you let your guard down and interpret what your opponent says as said from good will, he



can do the same for you. Both of you are then free to consider each other's positions without fear that your opponent would seize the opportunity to force you to make concessions. That freedom to pursue mutual understanding can be very good and sometimes lead people to change their minds. Just remember that not every conversation is like that; it requires

special conditions that cannot always be there.

Second, it is okay to insist on some ground rules; doing so is not a sign of thin skin. If the person you are talking with is not interested in understanding your position or representing it fairly, the discussion is not worth it. Both parties must agree to be civil and honest; if that's not possible, the conversation should not be had.

Third, remember a discussion can be worth having even if you know your opponent will not be convinced. Political candidates know that in a public debate they're not going to convince each other, but that was never the point. They are trying to show to the general public that their position is reasonable. If they refused to engage in the discussion at all, it casts doubt on how sound their position really is. The same is true of us. It is worth speaking up in public settings and responding to our opponents if for no other reason than showing other people that our opponents can be responded to.

Fourth, remember that arguments are not won in days but in months and years. It is unusual for people to admit they are wrong in the moment. Instead, they tend to stew on points that are bothering them for weeks and months, trying to think up responses. It might take years for them to grant that a point you raised was insurmountable and that they were wrong. Do not be discouraged if they do not make such an admission in the moment.

Fifth, do not be discouraged if you cannot field every point your opponent raises. We are human, it takes time for us to think and gather evidence. Years down the road you might find the answer to a point your opponent raised. Just because you cannot find it in the middle of the discussion does not mean the answer does not exist.

Lastly, remember that no matter what direction your discussion goes, God is always right. Human reasoning is useful, but it is limited and fallible. God knows everything and can neither deceive nor be deceived, so have confidence that what God has said is true, regardless of whether you were able to persuade someone else of it or not.
