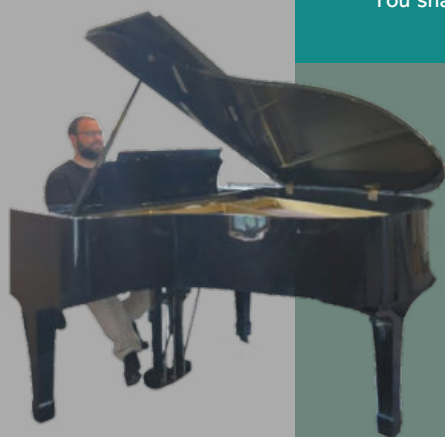

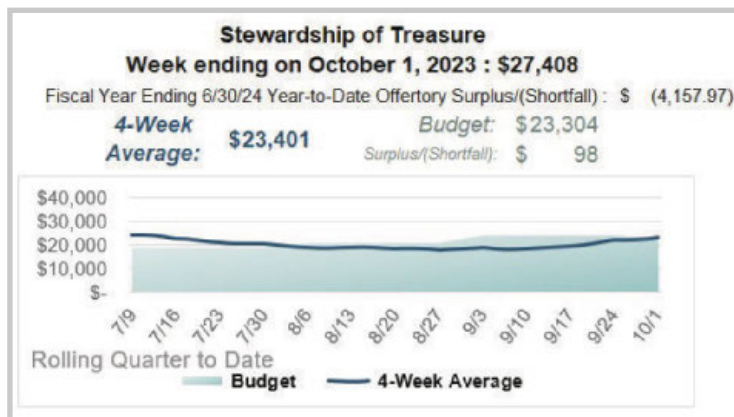

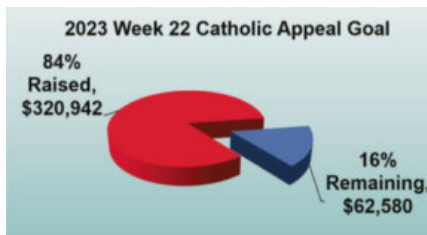

Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

HE WILL COME AGAIN TO JUDGE THE LIVING AND THE DEAD

"Then will appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see the Son of man coming on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory." – Matthew 24:30

We say it in the creed all the time, that at His Second Coming, Christ will come as judge over all the earth. The signs that accompany that Second Coming are dramatic to say the least, but all that drama pales in comparison to the moment when Christ descends from heaven with His angels for the Final Judgment.

"For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face." (1 Corinthians 13:12) Our Lord's full glory and majesty has always been slightly veiled for us on this earth. We see Him



in the Blessed Sacrament, but veiled under the appearances of bread and wine. Even our greatest consolations in prayer (and those can be overwhelming) are mere glimpses of His full glory.

So now imagine what it is like to behold Him as He is when He comes again. It will be overwhelming in every sense of the term. We will see power beyond our comprehension, goodness beyond our wildest imagination, beauty greater than anything we thought possible.

That part of it will be universal. In other regards, we can expect a divided opinion. Some will be happy to see Him. For those who have known, served, and loved Him in this life, this will be a dream come true. "Behold, He comes, leaping upon the mountains, bounding over the hills...My beloved speaks and says to me: 'Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away; for lo, the winter is past, the rain is over and gone.'" (Song of Songs 2:8, 10-11) The One whom they have sought all their lives has finally come. Light has broken into the darkness of the world.

It won't be all rejoicing. "For every one who does evil hates the light, and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed." (John 3:20) Those who told themselves that their sins weren't so bad will see just how bad they are in the light of Christ's goodness. Those who thought they could hide their wrongdoing and never be found out will know otherwise before the all-knowing God. Those who said there was no judgment and no God will see the wounds Christ bore on the Cross for their sins and realize that it was all true. But by then it will be too late.

If you are not right with Christ now, go to Confession and be reconciled to Him. When He comes again, there is no need to be among those who see Him and despair. The ball is in your court, you are free to leave sin behind and serve Him as your King. Doing so will make the Second Coming something to hope for rather than to fear.
