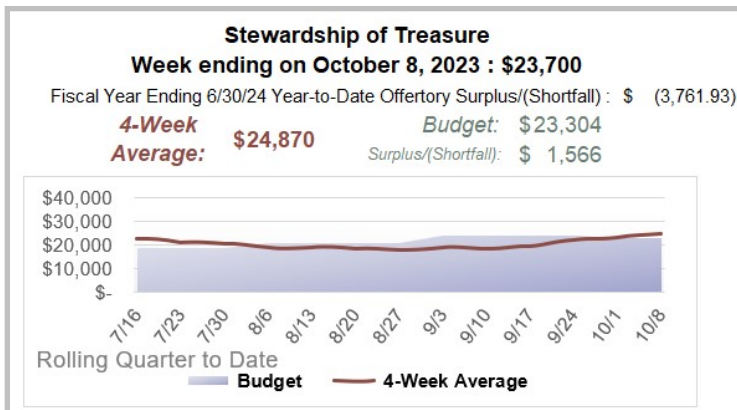

# Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

## FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

### ON PRAYER

In Catholicism 101, we've now made it to the topic of prayer. We only have one class after this on devotions. The fall session is wrapping up fast.

As I sit down to write this bulletin column, it strikes me that the camps divide starkly on the enjoyability of prayer. For some, it is a necessary drudgery. For others, there is nothing they would rather spend their time doing. For some it is bland and boring, and for others it is rich and sweet.

This isn't a matter of temperament. No personality test will predict who will like prayer and who won't. In fact, those who love prayer frequently remember a time in their lives when they didn't. The sweetness of prayer is a gift that people receive when they start actually praying and when God sees fit to give it. Once that sweetness has been known, nothing else on this earth compares.

I think this is why prayer is a topic of such interest. The gifts



people receive in prayer can be extraordinary. The possibility of speaking to God, of knowing God, has a strong appeal (as it should). In the same way having an audience with the president of the United States would be exciting, even more so the King of Heaven.

The possibility that the all-knowing, all-good God would speak to us in return is even more exciting. He knows things

no one else does and can advise you on what to do with a wisdom that is unparalleled anywhere.

It is amazing to that this all-powerful God would grant you favors, that those favors could be anything, and that they are guaranteed to be good. Prayer takes on a certain appeal.

But the sweetness of prayer is in something deeper. In a world of darkness and shadows, it is sweet to bask in the light of His goodness. When you realize how good God is, it becomes sweet to receive His directions and corrections. When you realize how good God has been to you, it is sweet to spend your time giving honor to Him who has so loved you.

The favors and the sweetness do not always last. That is where the lovers of prayer are sometimes forced to look to the reluctant curmudgeons. They know that prayer can be difficult, and they know they need to keep up with it anyway because God is worthy of it. We persevere in prayer to honor, to atone, to petition, and to give thanks to God. Sometimes that is sweet to us and sometimes it isn't, but it is worth doing regardless. .
