





KATE'S CORNER

THE IMPORTANCE OF NAMES

As some of you may know, I spent three weeks last summer as a missionary in the streets of Boston. It was truly an amazing experience, and taught me a lot about people. One of the first things we learned as new missionaries was the importance of learning and remembering peoples' names. This may seem like a small, unimportant detail in the grand scheme of things, but it turns out that knowing a person's name can have a huge impact.

If you think about it, it makes a lot of sense that having people remember your name would be important to anyone,



but especially to the homeless. Most often, we hear our names called when we are needed or wanted by another person. We are recognized and known, at least at some level, and we are wanted by the person calling our name. Some of the friends I made on the streets had not had their names called like that in years, and it was

both beautiful and a little sad to see how much it touched them every time we saw them and still remembered their names. In a similar way, many of them took great pride in remembering our names, and some fact about each of us.

Additionally, in the scriptures the Lord tells us "I have called you by name: you are mine" (Isaiah 43:1). In calling us each by name, Our Lord is showing that He knows and loves each of us individually. It's the same thing when we are speaking to each other. Using the other person's name in conversation can give them a sense of dignity and of being known, and even loved. If we are meant to love one another as Christ loves us, it seems like learning and using people's names could be a good (and relatively easy) place to start.
