



### Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life


### FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

#### CONFESSION

Confession is one of the most important sacraments and probably the one people drag their feet on most. "Do I really have to? Surely, there must be another way!" While our reluctance is understandable, the short answer is yes, we need to. Confession is the ordinary means by which sins are forgiven for those who are baptized. After the Resurrection, Jesus delegated His authority to forgive sins to the twelve apostles. "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you bind on earth are bound in heaven and whose sins you loose on earth are loosed in heaven." (John 20:23) Those twelve apostles, the original bishops, passed the authority they received onto other bishops, who passed them on to other bishops, and so on and so forth until we get to Bishop Deeley himself.

It is because of this chain of apostolic succession that confession works. If you asked me to absolve you, I could say the words and nothing would happen. When a priest says the words of absolution, something happens. God has given him authority to do something that ordinary human beings cannot.

Remember Our Lord's words to the apostles: "You will sit on twelve thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel." (Matthew 19:28) When you go to confession, you're approaching the



judgment seat of the apostles to seek a pardon. You know that if it goes to trial at the particular judgment, you will be found guilty, but you have the chance now, to seek pardon from those to whom God gave the authority to grant it. You have TO come sorry for your sins with the intent not to commit them again, but if you do, the whole sentence could be avoided.

Such is the system Christ set up for the forgiveness of sins. It's not complicated and there's no mystery to it. If that's the case, then why does everyone seem to want to find a loophole to get out it? Shame. Confession requires us to name things that we have done that we are deeply ashamed of and wish no one would know. It's helpful to keep in mind that God already does know and at the final judgment,

everyone who has ever lived will know, too. Those sins won't be hidden forever, no matter what you do. Given that they're known, the question is how you handle it. Do you try to make it right? Do you acknowledge that you've done wrong? Or do you hide it or try to justify it? The former approach means suffering through the shame for a moment, and receiving incredible graces on the other side. The latter only makes our situation worse.

Take advantage of Confession. Go regularly (monthly even). Keep a clean slate. You don't know the day or the hour when the Lord will take you, and the more we put off Confession, the more we get drawn into sin, away from God. Don't hold back. You have nothing to lose but your pride, and heaven itself to gain.
