

FRIDAY EVENING STATIONS OF THE CROSS SIMPLE SUPPERS: On Fridays during Lent, three of our churches are making the Stations of the Cross. Join us at 5:30 pm at either St. Jude or St. Gregory the Great, followed by a simple supper. At Holy Martyrs, Stations of the Cross will be made at 6:30 pm after the simple supper.

SUFFERING WITH A PURPOSE BY HUBERT VAN ZELLER: Our parish Lent book is *Suffering with a Purpose* by Fr. Hubert Van Zeller. For each Station of the Cross, Fr. Van Zeller offers a reflection on how to take up our own crosses. Just as Our Lord took something as terrible as the Cross and turned it into the greatest act of love the world has ever known, so too we can take our crosses and turn them into something beautiful for the greater glory of God. A **donation** of \$3 is suggested for each book to help defray the costs.

2024, every diocese in the world has been asked to host listening sessions for the public. The Diocese of Portland has scheduled three sessions on the following dates in the State of Maine:

- Saturday, February 17, 10 am-11:30 am: Holy Rosary Parish Center, Caribou
- Saturday, March 2, 10 am -11:30 am: St. John the Baptist School Hall, Winslow
- Saturday, March 9, 10 am-11:30 am: St. Maximilian Kolbe Hall, Scarborough

The Synod on Synodality is a three-year process of listening and dialogue on communion, participation, and mission for the Catholic Church. It began in October 2021 and concludes in October 2024.

A synod is, by definition, an assembly of clergy and laity in the Church. The intent of this current Synod of Synodality is not to be a one-time experience but an ongoing opportunity for discernment and collectively moving the Church forward.

Listening sessions are for Catholics, practicing and non-practicing, as well as non-Catholics to express their thoughts and reflections.

These planned listening sessions are an important part of this worldwide synodal process of engagement and collective commitment by the people of God to grow and journey together.

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

MARRIAGE AND HOLY ORDERS

As Catholicism 101 wraps up its final class of the winter session (spring session to start on April 5) our last two sacraments to discuss are the sacraments of service: Marriage and Holy Orders.



Both of these sacraments give grace to live out a particular vocation in the Church. In Holy Matrimony you are given grace to work out your salvation as a spouse and a parent, and to help your family reach heaven with you. As a deacon, priest, or bishop, you are given the graces (and responsibility) of teaching, governing, and sanctifying the Church. You will work out your salvation not as a father of a family, but as a pastor of souls.

In both cases, when we reach the pearly gates, God will want to see the fruits of our labors, but these fruits will look very different. The married man or woman will be asked how they acquitted their responsibilities to their spouse and their family. Did they honor and cherish their spouse all the days of their life, in good times and in bad? Did they help their spouse and their children on the way to heaven? Did they live married life in a way that was good and holy?

The man in Holy Orders will be asked how he acquitted his responsibilities to the souls within his parish. Did he tell them everything they need to know to get to heaven? Did he draw them back when they strayed from the straight and narrow? Was he tireless in bringing them to the means of grace, the sacraments, and was he generous in offering himself as Christ's instrument in the world?

Whatever our vocation is (and for most people, it's marriage) we must live it well. Holiness will look different in different states of life, but we can only be holy in the state of life we're actually in. Remember, on our own efforts, we cannot be a perfect spouse or a perfect pastor. But we're not on our own. Through the sacraments, God gives us His help to live out these vocations well.

Sometimes people wonder what the difference is between a natural marriage (two non-Catholics getting married by a justice of the peace) and a Catholic, sacramental marriage. The difference is grace. In a sacramental marriage, you are bound together forever by God. Your marriage has a different mission than a natural marriage, namely the pursuit of heaven. And you have supernatural help given to you to live this in a way that is literally out of this world. A holy marriage, in which God's grace is welcome and at work, can be a great light in a frequently dark world.

Live out your vocation well. People can get to heaven by different roads, but your road will always be the vocation that you are in.


