

Our Haiti door collection, which supports our sister parish in Haiti, is being held this weekend, **February 24/25**. Despite an increase in violence and political uncertainty, St. Therese Parish in Marbial, Haiti had a joyous celebration of their parish feast day on February 4 led by the Pastor Fr. Joseph Herol. Quarterly support from POTHE is used primarily to help with school expenses. 
Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

AT MOTHER CABRINI'S SHRINE

Last week, I wrote about my three mile pilgrimage, walking from Fordham to Mother Cabrini's shrine in New York City.

On finally arriving at the church, it too fell short of my English gothic expectations of a pilgrimage. Fortunately, the Cloisters (a medieval art museum) was right across the street and so that was easily remedied.



Entering the shrine church, the first thing that caught my eye was Mother Cabrini laying in the high altar. At first I was a little disturbed because her whole body was laying there including appeared to be her incorrupt head. Later, I was reassured that the head was made of wax, but the habit and bones underneath all belonged to Mother Cabrini.

Behind the main altar was a statue of the Sacred Heart and surrounding it was a large mosaic depicting the life of Mother Cabrini. It showed her in audience with Pope Leo XIII, being told that she would be a missionary not in the east (China) but in the west. It showed her in America, teaching children, founding schools, caring for the sick, and finally entering into her glory in heaven.

While I was there, I bought a third class relic of Mother Cabrini. A third class relic is one that was touched to a first class relic of the saint (usually a piece of bone.) You can't buy first or second class relics (that would be simony) but third class relics can be. On the front of the relic card, there was a picture of Mother Cabrini that struck me. It showed her with the poor of New York huddled around her. In the picture, Jesus is looking down on Mother Cabrini from heaven, His heart burning with love. The poor are all looking towards Mother Cabrini, but her eyes are firmly fixed on the heart of Jesus. As Mother Teresa used say, we are called to give God's love and we cannot give what we do not have. Mother Cabrini accomplished great works of mercy by allowing her heart to be inflamed with the fire of love in the heart of Jesus. She saw the poor the way Jesus does and cared for them with the kind of love that He has for them.

I left the shrine, struck by the fact that a saint was buried so close by and yet I knew relatively little about her. She had walked the same streets I was walking now. As I passed by

homeless people on my return to campus, it struck me that Mother Cabrini cared for people in similar situations in this very place about a hundred years ago. Holiness is possible to live out in this country. Mother Cabrini proved that and became a canonized saint, and yet I knew very little about her.


