

As you may be aware, violence and unrest continue to escalate in Haiti, and the country is in chaos. We continue to stay in touch with the parishes we support. Continued on p. 3





HAITI UPDATE: Since they are in the southern part of the country they remain safe but the unsafe road conditions near the capital have delayed the delivery of food and other supplies. When asked about the situation in Marbial the pastor Fr. Herol responded: "Good evening to you and to each member of your church, supporters of the parish of Sainte Thérèse de Marbial! Yes, violence is gradually increasing in the country's capital (Port-au-Prince). I am doing well in Marbial....the Marbialese community is doing well, however the high cost of living and the division of the country are causing great hunger. Thank you for your solidarity, thank you for always thinking of the parish community (Marbial)." We will be sending an Easter gift to Haiti soon. Thank you for your ongoing generosity.



FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

St. Patrick and the Seeds of Faith

Happy St. Patrick's Day to you all!

It's a rare occasion that St. Patrick's Day falls on a Sunday and it affords me an unusual opportunity to talk about this great saint (not that I ever needed an excuse.)

It's no secret that March 17 is mostly an occasion for ethnic pride. I fondly remember going to Mary Honan's annual St. Patrick's Day party (of Holy Martyrs fame) and seeing Jack Mullen decked out from head to toe in green seguins. A feeling of national pride fills the air that day and you could be forgiven that day if you thought the Promised Land was somewhere in County Cork.

But there's another side to St. Patrick's Day and that is the commemoration of the saint himself. St. Patrick is the great patron of Ireland because he is responsible for bringing the light of faith to a land that until then dwelt in the darkness of paganism. Patrick is celebrated, not because he's the greatest of the Irish race (he was of Roman descent), but because he showed Erin and her children the way to heaven.

St. Patrick's preaching took deep roots and until recently it was taken for granted that those roots would hold until the world should come to an end. Such has not been the case. Irish Americans have largely abandoned the faith and (I'm told) so has Ireland herself. So much of what there was to be proud of in being of Irish descent was being able to claim membership in a race that kept the Catholic faith over centuries, who spread it to the far corners of the world, and did so in the face of great persecution and trial. Now those memories stand as a shameful judgment on the mass apostasy of our current generation.

But there is hope. We took for granted that the roots Patrick planted would last forever. I will speak for myself, but for a long time I never considered how Patrick planted the seeds of faith and under what circumstances. Patrick walked into a hostile environment when he first preached to the Irish. Almost all of Ireland was hostile and pagan and he must have thought the hope of bringing these people to the faith was slim. But Patrick was faithful and bold. He simply preached the faith. Not everyone listened (the high king at Tara tried to kill him), but some did.

Within a generation, the dynamic had changed entirely. I recently read a biography of St. Columcille who lived roughly a hundred years after St. Patrick. By Columcille's time, all of Ireland, including the high king, was Catholic. Monasteries had sprouted up everywhere and those monks, who so recently had been preached to, converted the rest of the barbarian tribes in Europe. Saints proliferated in Ireland to such a degree that in the whole biography, I couldn't find more than a couple of abbots mentioned who hadn't been canonized. All this happened within recent memory of a time when most of Ireland was pagan and was trying to assassinate the lone Christian missionary.

So the faith was planted, so it must be restored. If Patrick's bold preaching and practice of the faith brought the faith to Ireland and her children, so ours can bring it back.




