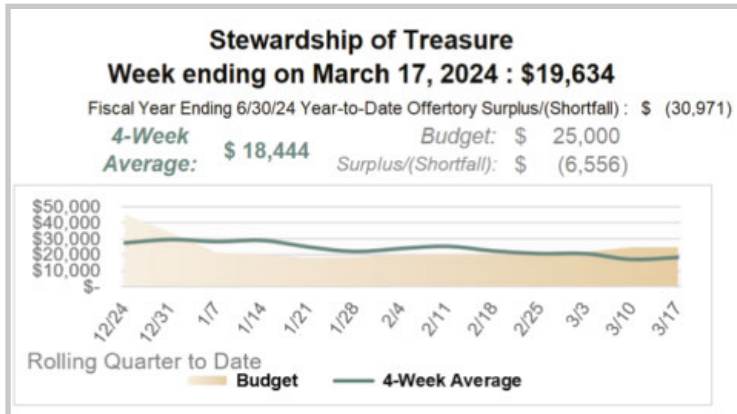

The name is Latin for "Work of God." Opus Dei's mission is to spread the Christian message that every person is called to holiness and that every honest work can be sanctified.

Morning of Recollection for Women: The morning schedule begins at 9:30 am and includes a meditation by the priest, a talk given by a lay member on topics relating to the Christian life, and time for silent prayer. There will also be an opportunity for Confession/Spiritual Direction beginning at 9:30 am. The meditation begins at 10:30 am and Holy Mass begins at 11:50 am. Babysitting is available. The recollection is conducted by a priest of Opus Dei.

Evening of Recollection for Men: The evening schedule runs from 6 to 7:45 pm and includes opportunities for Confession, a talk by a layman on Christian virtue, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, a meditation guided by a priest of Opus Dei, time for silent prayer, Adoration, and Benediction. Confession is available from 5:15-6:00 pm. Snacks and refreshments will follow in the hall.

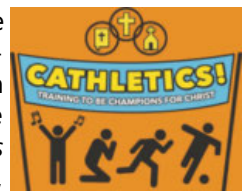

Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

NATURAL LAW AND THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

In last week's bulletin column, we considered how the very age and longstanding nature of the Ten Commandments should give us pause and make us think that perhaps they serve a real purpose. This week, I want to consider briefly what that purpose might be. To do this, we need to consider not just what society is like when one of the commandments is crossed, but what it would be like if the commandment wasn't there at all. What function does that moral boundary play in our society?

Take lying for instance. It seems like such a small sin. No one's bones are broken by a lie, and sometimes people don't even realize they are lied to and their lives go on as if nothing ever happened. But imagine what the world be like if lying wasn't considered wrong at all. How would you ever know for sure if someone was telling you the truth? If everyone agreed that there was nothing wrong with lying, then you can never trust whether what someone is telling you is sincere or they're just playing you to their own advantage. Trust breaks down. Human relationships get strained. No one, even businesses, can depend even generally on people keeping their promises and agreements. In short, society falls apart.

Likewise, take adultery. I have heard people argue that the taboo against adultery is just a hold over from Christian social conditioning and that you can rise above the gut instincts that tell you this is wrong. (Seriously, people in a post Christian society think this way....) But imagine what society would like if really and truly everyone believed that adultery was not wrong. It would mean the destruction of the family. If relations outside marriage are fine, then people will have children with many different parents in many different households as a rule rather than as an exception. It would be nearly impossible for parents to care for their own children when they are scattered among so many different places. Without stable households, the kind of human formation that parents are meant to hand on to their children will be lost. The wisdom of one generation fails to get handed on to the next and society quickly degenerates.

You might be thinking to yourself, "This would never happen. Lying is obviously wrong. Adultery is obviously wrong." It is true, we have a natural gut reaction against these things. Something about not telling the truth, about the betrayal of a spouse, the murder of an innocent, the theft of someone's property, turns our stomach. No matter how much we try to justify these things in the abstract, our nature rebels against them. That's why most societies (although not all) have come to similar moral conclusions. On the whole, these kinds of moral lines make sense.

The commandments aren't arbitrary. Even apart from revelation, most people have known that these things were wrong. Tolerating these evils does great damage to us and to others. When God gave us the commandments, He didn't do so to be mean. He did it because He loved us.
