



Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

THE FIRST COMMANDMENT

"I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. You shall have no other gods before me." – Exodus 20:2-3

As a child, when topics of religion came up, one of my uncles used to like to say, "What difference does it make? It's all the same God." In other words, differences between religions didn't matter. In my uncle's case, he only meant that he didn't think it mattered whether you were Protestant or Catholic, but in time I met people who would use the same phrase to mean that it didn't matter whether you were Catholic, Muslim, Buddhist, or pagan. Their argument was that all of these deities were just different angles or different views on the one supreme deity, whom Christians call God, Muslims call Allah, Hindus call Nirvana and pagans call Zeus. If it's all the same God, why can't we learn from other religions? If we want to grow in our relationship with God, we should listen to these other traditions who might have learned things about God that we didn't know. After all, it's all the same God.

It's important to note that God thought otherwise. The prohibition on not having false gods before Him is a fairly plain indication that it's not all the same God. Even the adherents of false religions would usually grant that. The God that the apostles knew and preached is of a different character than the gods of the pagans or even the God of Islam. For one thing, the pagan gods aren't good. They demand things like child sacrifice, (Jeremiah 19:4-6) they lie, cheat, and steal and think nothing about it. Destruction and ruin follow wherever they go. How could these gods be the same as the one true God? God's answer is quite clear: they aren't.

What about different takes on the same God? Surely those differences don't matter so much. Again, God thought otherwise. Jesus Christ, during His earthly life, warned His apostles to be wary of false Messiahs who would come in His name (Matthew 24:24). The apostles likewise warned the early church about listening to anyone who departed from their teachings. "But even if we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to that which we preached to you, let him be accursed." (Galatians 1:8) What's the danger? By listening to false prophets and false teachers, we get led astray from obedience to Christ and His commands.

In the Old Testament, when God called Israel back from idolatry, He compared idolatry to an act of adultery. God was their spouse and they had abandoned Him for someone. Just as a husband or wife should have eyes only for their spouse, so too a faithful soul should have ears only for God and the teachings of His Church. This is why the first commandment includes not just false worship, but also that we protect and guard our faith from voices that would lead us away from God.


