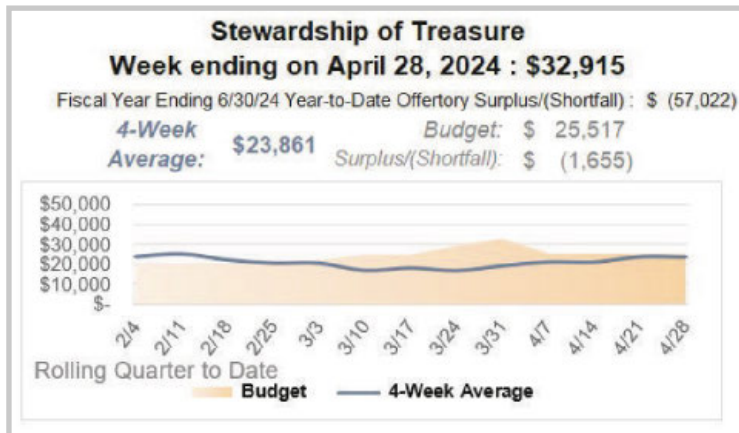

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS:


The solemnity will be celebrated at all Sunday Masses at Sacred Heart church on June 8 and 9. Join us in celebrating this solemn feast day of our namesake.

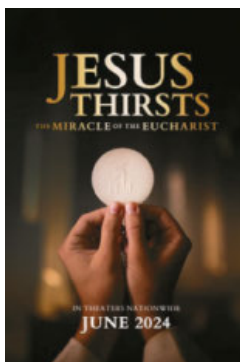

PART 2: BR. THEO TEACHES A CAT TO SWIM
