

SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI: GOD CHOOSES TO COME CLOSE

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today is the awesome *Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ* or *Corpus Christi Sunday*. It is also the Patronal Solemnity of our parish, which was canonically merged by Bishop Malone back in 2011. Today, we acknowledge and affirm our undying belief that the bread and wine consecrated at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass ceases to exist as bread and wine and truly, really, substantially becomes Jesus, His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. The Holy Eucharist is not a symbol nor a mere remembrance of our Lord. *He chooses to come close to us* humbly in the Holy Eucharist to fill us with His divine Presence and grace. He gives us access into the intimate Communion of Love who is God, Father, Son, Holy Spirit.

St. Thomas Aquinas once said that the Holy Eucharist is the only instance of change we encounter in this world that is exactly the opposite of everything else. The appearances of bread and wine stay the same, but the very essence or substance of these realities, which cannot be detected by a microscope, is totally transformed. What was once bread and wine are now Jesus' Body and Blood.

This ongoing presence of Jesus fulfills His words, "I am with you always, to the end of the age." It is incredibly distressing to hear that polling shows that 70% of US Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in Holy Communion. Our US Bishops have declared a 3-year, grass-roots Eucharistic Revival, of which we find ourselves in the middle. It is not a program but an effort to engage and reach each and every heart and soul. A renewed focus on the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and Eucharistic Adoration will lead us to witness to the power, love, and presence of Jesus Christ with us.

Over these past 2 years, you may have seen that there has been much love, time, attention, and devotedness to the enhancement of our sacred spaces and liturgies here in our parish. We have seen the polishing and shining of many of our sacred vessels and objects, the care and mending of vestments, the acquiring and purchasing of new liturgical parchments for our sanctuaries, all done by our many faithful parishioners. Our many talented choir directors and musicians diligently prepare for Masses each week to help us raise our voices and hearts to God; our faithful altar servers enhance our reverence of the Mass as well as help all of us to pray as we ought. I also find our parish so blessed to have Eucharistic Adoration at each one of our churches.

The Bishops have offered us a beautiful prayer that comes from one of the visions of Our Lady of Fatima. I invite you as to recite it often, especially today and during every consecration we are privileged to witness:

My God, I believe, I adore, I hope, and I love You! I beg pardon for those who do not believe, nor adore, nor hope, nor love You. (repeat three times)


At the end of our 11 am Mass at Sacred Heart today, we will process with the Most Blessed Sacrament through the streets of Yarmouth. *God will be coming near* to so many people, whether they are in their cars passing by, standing in their driveways, or walking their dogs. What an awe-filled mystery we acknowledge in special way today but are privileged to witness and participate in every Sunday, or even every day. **Our God desires to come close to us. To you. To me.**

My brothers and sisters, may you and I never lose our Eucharistic amazement!

PART 3:

Fr. Edmund Teaches Br. Theo What He was Made For

While Br. Dismas had only ever been trying to help Br. Theo, it was getting old. Br. Theo was tired of hearing about what things were or were not for. The next day, while Br. Theo finished up washing the floor, he had an idea. "I'll show him what things are for! This old mop bucket is as good for a prank as it is for floor washing. I'll balance it above his door so when he walks out, it dumps all over him." This was not a very nice thing for a monk to do, but Br. Theo was about to learn his lesson.


Br. Theo agreed and this time for real. He soon learned how the farm worked and lived a happy life in St. Benedict's monastery.


