




OPUS DEI—FEAST DAY OF ST JOSEMARIA ESCRIVA:

Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

AN INTRODUCTION TO THE HOLY MARTYRS OF NORTH AMERICA

On July 8-10, I'll be giving talks on the Holy Martyrs of North America. I highly encourage you to attend if you're able. Holy Martyrs is the first church in the United States to be named for St. Isaac Jogues and companions. These are local heroes who have an incredible story. Our parish should know that story and be proud of it, but many of us probably don't know it all.

When I first heard of the North American Martyrs, I frankly wasn't that interested. At first, I thought it referred to the Jesuit martyrs in El Salvador from the 1980s. Then when I found out it had to do with 17th century native American and colonial history, I expected it to be a dry topic. Colonial history seemed to be an endless cycle of building settlements, nearly starving during the winter, and using crude and primitive tools to survive.

In my junior year at Fordham, I went on a vocations retreat with the Jesuits at Our Lady of Martyrs Shrine in Auriesville, New York. This is the place where St. Rene Goupil was killed, where St. Isaac Jogues was held captive and preached to the Iroquois, and where St. Kateri Tekakwitha was born. Far from being dry, what I learned about St. Isaac Jogues and his companions was deeply moving.

The Holy Martyrs of North America were Jesuit missionaries from France. Samuel de Champlain was in the process of establishing the colony of Quebec. He built friendships and alliances with the area Indian tribes and became concerned with their salvation. He asked the king of France to fund and send missionaries to preach the Gospel to these people who had never heard it before. At first Franciscan Recollects and Capuchins were sent, but soon Jesuits became the primary missionaries.

I'm afraid popular culture associates missionary work with military conquest. It wasn't that way at all in New France. The missionaries left the comforts of their homeland and went to live and build friendships with the Native Americans of Quebec, Ottawa, and Huronia. The difficulties involved with this were immense. Adapting to the conditions of life in Huronia, from paddling a birch bark canoe down the St. Lawrence to living in a smoky longhouse with a lot of roommates, required much sacrifice on the part of the missionaries. Learning the language required patience and dedication. Navigating the internal and external politics of the tribe and maintaining a relationship of trust with all parties was extremely difficult. But they did it, because these were men and women who were loved by Jesus Christ and their souls were worth saving.

When I think of a life given completely to the service of Jesus Christ, I think of the Holy Martyrs of North America. These were great men who labored near our home. They are worth knowing about.


