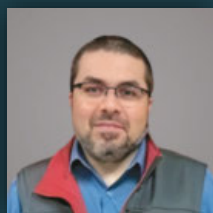

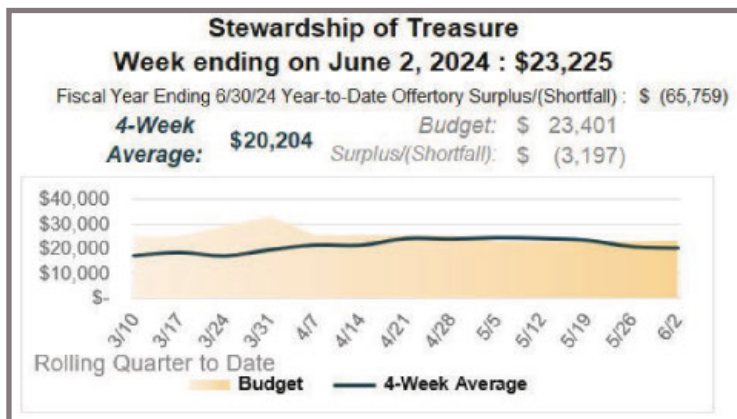

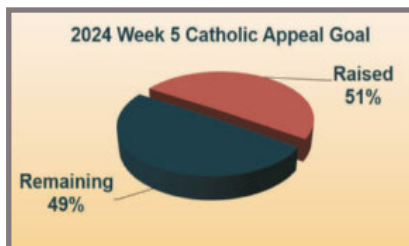

Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

THE HOLY MARTYRS OF NORTH AMERICA: ST. ISAAC JOGUES

Last week, I gave an overview of the Holy Martyrs, but this week I wanted to narrow in on some particular details. I thought it would be worth talking about St. Isaac Jogues.

Isaac Jogues was a native of France, like all the other North American Martyrs. He was assigned to the Huron mission with St. John de Brebeuf and labored among them for a few years. While returning to Huronia from Quebec, Isaac Jogues' flotilla of canoes was ambushed by the great enemy of the Huron: the Iroquois.

Jogues and his companions were led into the woods of what is now upstate New York. All of them were brutally tortured. Jogues had to watch as Hurons whom he had recently guided to the faith and baptized were brutally killed by the Iroquois. His only consolation was that now, since they had come to faith and received the sacraments, their souls would be with God forever in heaven.

Jogues was singled out for torture in a special way. Some of his fingers were cut off. He and his companions were forced to run the gauntlet and at one point were tied down while small Mohawk children threw hot coals on their bellies. After these tortures, they were required to continue the march deeper into upstate New York.

Jogues (a priest), Guillaume Couture, and Rene Goupil (laymen who volunteered to assist the Jesuit mission) were all held prisoner in what is now Auriesville, New York. Rene Goupil (one of the martyrs) was struck down with a tomahawk in front of Jogues. Jogues meanwhile was adopted by an Iroquois family to take the place of one of their members who had died in war. Despite all the tortures, he never lost sight of his reason for being there: the salvation of souls. He made it his mission to make Christ known and loved even among the Mohawk and to guide them towards heaven.

Some grew to like him, others not so much. For a long time, Jogues refused to attempt escape in order to try to win the Mohawk over to the faith. When his enemies grew too powerful, he escaped with a Dutch fur trader down the Hudson River and returned to France. When he showed up at the Jesuit novitiate in Rouen dressed in rags, they didn't recognize him. He asked to see the superior and was told that it would have to wait. Jogues insisted: he had news from the missions. At this point he was asked, "Have you heard

anything of Fr. Jogues? We are afraid he is dead." Jogues replied tearfully, "It is he that is speaking to you!"

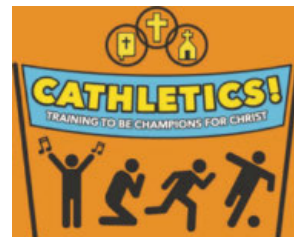
Jogues returned to the Iroquois two years later. He believed his vocation was there and took the opportunity to go as an ambassador for France to make peace with the Iroquois. The party opposed to him and the French seized the opportunity. Jogues was killed almost immediately. He gave everything he had, even his life, for love of Christ and love of the Iroquois, never expecting that love in return.
