



SUMMER RECREATION CAMP SCHOLARSHIPS— THANK YOU: Recently, we announced that our Needy Fund would support students in need with summer recreational



Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

THE PRAYER FOR GENEROSITY: PART 2

"To fight and not to heed the wounds." I think of the martyrs as the great example of this line. When the faith is lived well, it will not be lived unopposed. Do you continue to live it? Do you continue to speak about the faith when it exposes you to ridicule? Do you continue to live the faith when it leads you into danger? Do you care more about your objective as a Catholic, namely the greater glory of God, or about yourself? Of course, devoting yourself completely to God's service is for your good since it wins you an eternal reward in Heaven, but love of God should come first, and sometimes different priorities show through when the battle becomes fierce.

"To toil and not to seek for rest."
This was a novel concept for a high schooler. Growing up, I had the option of dialing things back when I so chose, with minimal consequences. Even in the world of competitive swimming, if I decided I couldn't keep pushing through a set, I stopped at the wall and told my coach I had a cramp. But in the service of God, the stakes are higher and the consequences for leaving




something half done can be severe. Sometimes the only way to persevere is to focus more on the objective and forget your own fatigue. The missionaries who labored among the Indians in Canada and New York never got a break from learning the language and enduring the harsh climate. If they paused to think about how tired they were, they would have given up. It was only their singleness of purpose, to save souls, that kept them going.

"To labor and to ask for no reward." One of my English teachers at Cheverus used to skip this line on the grounds that, "When I work, I like to get paid for it." Of course, St. Ignatius was of a different mind, since he was vowed to poverty. It is a game changer to go from saying, "I work for God because He will reward me," to "I work for God because my one desire is to do His will." Looking for rewards can be crippling. Sometimes you get to see conversions happen and sometimes you don't, but you need to keep working anyway. Sometimes people thank you, and sometimes they don't; you need to keep teaching the faith anyway. If those little rewards are what you were after all along, if they don't come, you throw in the towel. If your only criteria was that you wanted to serve God and do His will, then come what may, so long as you can say in good conscience that that was what you were doing, then you will be satisfied. In time the fruits will be there, but when they come, your heart will already be full because you can say to God, "I gave you everything I had and everything I am."
