
UPCOMING SECOND COLLECTIONS

Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

THE UNSINKABLE CHURCH

In the Gospel of the Mark, there's a passage in which the disciples are crossing the Sea of Galilee. A storm comes up, the boat is tossed, and the waves start pouring into the boat. Weirdly enough, I've been in this situation.

When we were kids, we had a paddleboat up to camp. At the age of seven or eight, the Water Wheeler paddleboat was the largest ship we were allowed to captain, and even then, only within the cove. There was one day in which my cousins and a few friends were visiting. There had to be at least six kids in this four-passenger boat, but it wouldn't surprise me if we had more.

That day was especially windy. Our normally calm lake had white caps on it (which we thought was really cool). We went downwind to explore a creek at the end of the cove. Going down was easy, but getting back was more difficult. With the boat overloaded with kids (small as we were) it was lower to the water than it might otherwise have been. The waves on the lake started splashing into the front of it.

I appointed myself captain of the ship since I was older than most and this was my family's camp. For reasons which still mystify me, this was accepted among the crew. At first, I ordered that



we paddle harder to overcome the force of the wind and get back to camp. Paddling harder meant we were going against the waves and more water poured in the boat. I tried shifting the passengers to the back of the paddleboat, but this left no one to man the pedals in the front and we were pushed back to the creek. I tried balancing my weight in the middle while others paddled, but the waves splashed in more. The more the waves splashed in, the lower the boat got, and the more water we took on. Finally, one of my cousins broke all the codes of chivalry and hollered, "Help!!!" My parents came out with the speedboat, brought us into the boat, and tied a ski rope to the front of the paddleboat.

You've probably been wondering why I've been telling you this. Apart from the sheer fact that I find it funny, it was this: when the speedboat started pulling, the paddleboat submerged completely underwater, only to pop up a moment later. You actually couldn't completely sink it. The material it was made of wouldn't allow it to. It could get very low in the water and cease to function very well, but it would never completely sink.

St. Peter's boat is considered a figure of the Church. Sometimes it looks like the Church will founder. She is caught in that Catch 22 where the more she takes on water, the lower the boat gets, the more water comes in. Of course, she's meant to sail and ferry souls to heaven, but even when she's waterlogged, she can never be sunk. Her Captain will never allow it.
