




September 1—POTHE Capital Campaign: This collection supports facility improvement projects with 100% of your donation directly funding these projects.

Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

SWIMMING AND HUMILITY—PART 2 HE HAS CAST DOWN THE MIGHTY FROM THEIR THRONES

Fast forward four years from last week's article. I was a junior at Cheverus and it was the high school swim championships. It's important to know that in the world of swimming there's a marked difference between what we call club swimming and high school swimming. The state championship I describe earlier was a club event. Club events can be very competitive. Swimmers who swim for clubs swim six days a week, eleven months out of the year, two-three hours a day. US Swimming Clubs are the feed for the Olympics.

The high school league is a different culture entirely. High school swim season only lasts from November through February. A high school team will have many swimmers who are trying the sport for the first time. Many who swim for high school just train for swimming during those four months. Consequently, while high school swimming is a lot of fun, it's not as competitive as club swimming. Being a year round club swimmer, I was used to winning in high school swimming and my teammates had more or less come to expect it of me.

If that sounds somewhat cocky, you'd be right. Just wait and see what follows.

I was signed up for two individual events in the state meet: the 200 IM and the 500 freestyle. Swimmers are listed with "seed times" in the programs; a seed time shows what that swimmer's fastest time for this event is. While there are exceptions, you can usually rely on swimmers to be within a half a second of their seed time. In the 200 IM, I was seeded second next to another club swimmer. We were supposed to be within hundredths of seconds from each other. I knew this swimmer and knew that it would be competitive; consequently, I was sweating that event for weeks. Meanwhile, I barely thought about the 500 freestyle. By all accounts it looked like it was in the bag. I was seeded first, twenty seconds ahead of the next fasted swimmer. Even if I went slower than usual, it should be good enough to win.

The 200 IM went off first. As predicted, Phillip and I were neck and neck. I poured every ounce of energy I had into that race. When we touched the wall, both of us had dropped tremendous amounts of time and I had won by a hair.

Then the 500 freestyle happened. You know, that event I thought I didn't need to think about. I bombed it. My mind kept telling my arms to move, but I had drained everything I had into the 200 IM. I had nothing left for the race. Not only did I go much slower than my best, but the Bangor swimmer who was seeded second did well and beat me by a long shot. It wasn't even close.

Normally this would be a, "win some lose some" kind of situation, except that Cheverus and Bangor were neck and neck for the state championship. When the final score was counted, Bangor won by six points. Had I focused on the 500 freestyle and swum at least close to my usual time, we would

have won our first class A swim championship ever.

God casts down the mighty from their thrones. In those times when we start to get proud, God has a way of reminding us of our own poverty and weakness. This is a good thing, it keeps us humble and when we're humble, we're more open to God's grace, and we're more charitable to other people. No one likes these little reminders, but it's these reminders that keep us from becoming proud and (frankly) from turning into jerks. Praise God!
