





FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

SANCTIFYING GRACE: DRESSING FOR THE WEDDING FEAST

Sanctifying grace is one of those concepts that I was never formally taught about either in CCD or while in seminary. I knew it was a thing because of political controversies about receiving Communion in a state of grace. This allowed me to piece together some kind of picture, but it left a lot of questions as to what grace was and what it did for my soul. I suspect there are more than a few people in a similar position, so I thought it was worth writing about.

In a nutshell, grace is help, given to us by God, to assist us on our way to heaven. There are two chief kinds of grace: actual grace and sanctifying grace. Actual grace are those nudges (sometimes not so subtle) that get you back on the straight and narrow. These are supernatural interventions that bring people to faith, hope, and charity. It's that kind of grace that the hymn, "Amazing Grace" is referring to.

Sanctifying grace is different. It acts on our soul and makes our souls holy and pleasing to God. When you have sanctifying grace in your soul, you can go to heaven. Without it, your soul is lost. Baptism and confession give sanctifying grace to a soul without it. Holy Communion, Confirmation, Anointing, Marriage, and Holy Orders increase sanctifying grace in souls that already have it.

I find this distinction between restoring a soul to grace and increasing grace a little difficult to explain for some reason, so I thought an analogy might be helpful. Recall Our Lord's parable of the wedding feast. The king has sent out his servants to the highways and byways to invite anyone and everyone to the wedding feast (i.e., heaven). However, one man arrives not dressed in a wedding garment. He is promptly thrown out of the feast into the darkness. A soul not clothed in sanctifying grace is like a person at a wedding feast not dressed for the occasion: that soul will not be allowed in.

To understand this better, I'm going to flesh this out using modern social standards for wedding attire. A soul not in a state of grace is like a guy who shows up to a wedding in a T shirt and gym shorts, having not shaved, showered, or brushed his teeth for weeks. He's just not appropriately dressed for the occasion. If he showed up like that, he would be asked to leave. Now, imagine this same man (having all the odors and scruff mentioned before) decided to shower and put on a collared shirt before going to the wedding. He may not look stunning, but he'd be allowed in. This is what Confession does for our souls: it cleans our souls up to the degree where we're at least allowed into the wedding banquet of heaven. Finally, imagine the same man looking around at the others at the wedding banquet and deciding to spiff up even more. He gets a haircut, trims his beard, rents a tux, and shows up dressed to the nines. That's what we mean by an increase in sanctifying grace. We were dressed before, but by God's grace, we are polished up and made even more radiant.
