
UPCOMING SECOND COLLECTIONS



Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

REFLECTIONS ON FAMILY CATECHESIS (FIRE), PART 1

We are just beginning our third year of family catechesis in the Parish of the Holy Eucharist. The hall at Holy Martyrs is packed with families from around the Parish. We do a little review as a large group at the beginning of the class and I've been encouraged to hear the children answer questions like, "What is grace?" "What is the matter of the sacrament of Confirmation?", "Name one of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit." Some of them are studying pretty hard in the weeks between classes and they're learning a lot.

One of the things I realized when registration came this year was that there are still a lot of families for whom this is new and have some hesitations. Those who have been involved know the fruits that this program produces, and there's a lot of enthusiasm around it, but if you haven't been involved, you don't have much of a window into what happens. It's harder to see that it's worth the investment.

In that regard, I have been derelict in my duties. The original purpose of this bulletin column was actually to keep the parish looped in on faith formation activities. To be frank, you'll probably start seeing doctrinal and spiritual reflections again soon, but I wanted to take a moment to share with you some of the things I've been seeing in our family catechesis program.

Family catechesis at Parish of the Holy Eucharist is called FIRE for Families in Religious Education. FIRE is the regular catechesis program for children in Kindergarten through 5th grade. There are several things that make this program stand out.

- There is a priest at FIRE every month.
- We have up to 140 children present at FIRE meetings; children get to meet other children from all four churches in our parish.
- While the target age is K-5, there are classes available for babies through teenagers.
- The curriculum through Sophia Press is robust.
- We pull out all the stops at our FIRE Mass so that the children get exposed to the most beautiful possible expression of the Mass.
- We choose an annual FIRE hymn that we sing at the beginning of every meeting, so that by the end of the year, the children know it by heart.
- Savio's Store gives children an opportunity to earn religious medals and statues by memorizing prayers.
- Parents have an opportunity to learn the faith themselves in the parent class.
- Parents have a central role in teaching their children the faith between classes.
- Our parish staff is directly involved in teaching and leading classes.

This is the bird's eye view of the program. Over the next few weeks, I'll zero in on some specifics.
