Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

REFLECTIONS ON FAMILY CATECHESIS (FIRE), PART 4 PARENT CLASSES

"You can't give what you don't have." This was a regular quip of Mother Teresa to her Missionary Sisters of Charity. She used to say it in regard to Eucharistic Adoration. If the sisters were going to bring Jesus' love out to the poor, how could they do that unless they first knew Jesus' love themselves? By spending time with Our Lord in the chapel, they could be filled with His love and then have something to carry out with them.

It is the same logic that led us to make parent classes an integral part of FIRE. Part of the philosophy of family religious education is that the parent is the best witness to the faith that a child can have. We hope that our students pay attention to their catechists, but we also know that for young children, if mom or dad says it's true, it must be gospel truth. Our catechists cover three lessons in the student book every month; the rest are taught by the parents.

But as Mother Teresa said, you can't give what you don't have. The parents in our program come from all kinds of backgrounds. To be frank, even the more invested parents come from a generation in which catechesis was less than systematic, and so they often feel like there are gaps in their knowledge. You can't teach what you yourself don't know.

For this reason, parents have their own class to attend during FIRE, while their children have theirs. The materials we cover addresses the same topics as the children are talking about, but we go through them on an adult level. It is important for parents that they understand the faith more deeply than their children do. It gives them confidence when they go to teach their children, and it gives them tools to answer questions when they come up, whether that be now or years down the road.

Remember, you don't know what you don't know. The Catholic faith has 2000 years of depth to it. For everything that we believe, there are nuances, distinctions, real life examples, and biblical citations to back it up. We want parents to know all of it (or as much of it as they can), so they in turn have it to hand on to their children.

Three years into the program, I think it's safe to say that this has been one of the most successful aspects of FIRE. The discussions that happen in those classes have deepened over the years we have been doing this, as the parents who attend learn more and become more familiar with each other. I have no doubt it is trickling down to their children too.

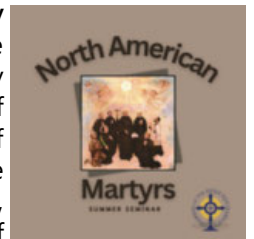

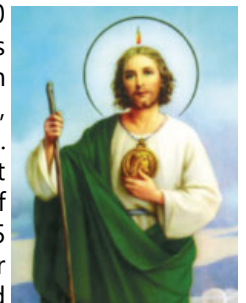

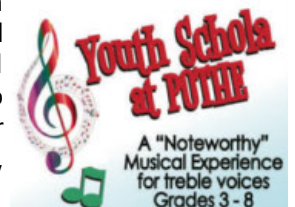
CELEBRATE THE HOLY MARTYRS: Please join us to celebrate the External Solemnity of the Holy Martyrs! The External Solemnity will be celebrated at all weekend Masses October 19 and 20 at Holy Martyrs. The Office of Readings will be prayed at Holy Martyrs at 3:30 pm on October 19. The Office of Readings is part of the Liturgy of the Hours, which is the daily prayer of the Church. The praying of the Office of Readings for this day includes three psalms, a passage from Sacred Scripture, an excerpt from the spiritual diaries of St. John de Brébeuf, and the "Te Deum" hymn. The Holy Martyrs, whose memorial we celebrate on October 19, include eight members of the Society of Jesus who were killed for their faith in Canada and New York State between the years 1642 and 1649, after working to bring the people of that area to the True Faith.
