Sharing God's Word ~ Through Stewardship and Pastoral Life

PASTOR'S PONDEROSA

My dear parishioners,

Last Monday, we celebrated the feast St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr. After each Mass this weekend, the faithful will have the opportunity to have their throats blessed. We pray for the intercession of St. Blaise in asking God to grant us the gift of good health this winter.

As many of you have seen, last week the Maine Law Court invalidated the 2021 law removing the statute of limitations on allegations of past abuse. Bishop Ruggieri has promulgated a statement on this decision which can be found on the diocesan website and on our parish website.

Please know that the Diocese of Portland has investigated with great care any reports of abuse brought forth, dedicating resources to examining every claim regardless of timeline and providing counseling and support services to those who have come forward. What is learned in those investigations informs us how future offenses can be avoided or prevented. We as a diocese are committed to the highest standards and protocols of keeping our parishes safe places for our children.

There has not been any substantiated report of abuse of a minor in Maine by a member of the clergy occurring within the last 25 years. The **Office of Safe Environment** is responsible for assisting the bishop in the diocese's efforts to combat and prevent child abuse. Created in 2002, the office is responsible for coordinating implementing the diocese's Safe Environment training programs including:

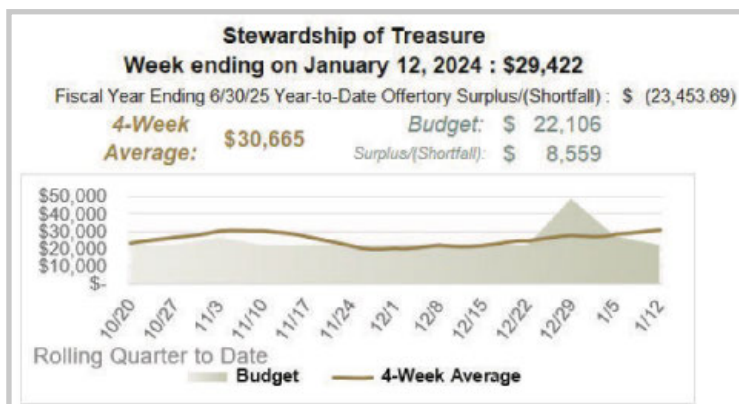
Protecting God's Children: a program designed to educate adults on how to recognize the warning signs that might indicate a child is being abused. This program also addresses in detail how predators behave leading up to an attempt to abuse. Over 21,000 have completed this training (including our 4,837 currently active clergy, employees and volunteers).

Circle of Grace: a program designed to educate both parents and children on the different ways that predators behave and how children can best protect themselves.

The office also performs criminal background checks and motor vehicle checks on all diocesan clergy, diocesan employees, and volunteers who work with children. In 2024, the diocese ran 5,802 background checks. Since 2007, the diocese has spent more than \$5 million on programs to protect children and to offer counseling/clinical outpatient mental health treatment free of charge to those who have come forth to us directly. This work will continue.

The impact that clergy abuse has had on the lives of both victims and survivors can never be understated. As a priest trying to lead souls to Our Lord through His Sacraments it makes me both sad and angry. The reprehensible conduct of certain clergy during that era represents a profoundly painful time that still has effects we all experience today. May we continually pray for justice and healing.

FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

FRIENDSHIP WITH JESUS

The following is a talk I gave to a high school retreat in 2014 when I was a Cap Corps Volunteer at Capuchin Youth and Family Ministries in Garrison, New York.

How many of you have been told before that Jesus is your friend? If Jesus is your friend, how many of you spend time with Him? How many of you talk to Him regularly?

I know when I was a teenager, talking with Jesus and spending time with Him would have sounded weird. I had heard that Jesus was my friend and in an abstract way I believed it, but there was one characteristic of Jesus that put Him in a whole other category from my other friends: the divinity bit.



Being told that I could have a conversation with Jesus would be like being told that the president of the United States wanted to have coffee with me tomorrow morning. Unless it's an FBI agent with a special connection to the White House telling me this, I'm not going to believe it. Mr. President has much more important things to concern himself than little old me. If the president of the United States is too far above me to sit and chat over coffee, Jesus Christ, the king of the universe reigning on His throne in Heaven is clearly out of my league.

This was the way I thought when I was a teenager, but right around the 8th grade, that view began to change. The church we went to in the summertime was the chapel for the Brothers of Christian Instruction (not to be confused with the Christian Brothers.) I was told once that one of the brothers used to pull up a chair on the altar, sit down, and whisper to Jesus through the doors of the tabernacle.

At first this struck me as bizarre, but over time I thought about it. What's in the tabernacle? The Eucharist. What is the Eucharist? The Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. If Jesus is standing right there in front of you, why shouldn't you be able to have a conversation with Him? Jesus Christ has ears to hear and a mouth to speak. It seemed to work for this Brother, so why not try it?

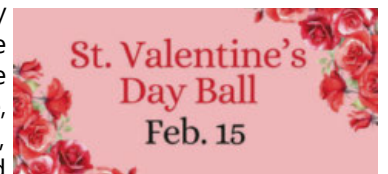
I went to a Catholic high school (I was a freshman that year) and one of the benefits of going to a Catholic school was that Jesus was literally in the house: on the first floor of Loyola Hall in the tabernacle of the school chapel. During my free periods, I used to slip away, go to the chapel, kneel down before the Blessed Sacrament and have a conversation with Jesus there. I talked to Him about my life, how things were going in school, how things were with my family, and I asked Him for help in things I was struggling with. Like any friendship, the more I spent time with Him and talked with Him, the more I got to know Him.
