

UPCOMING SECOND COLLECTIONS

March 5, Ash Wednesday—Church in Eastern Europe and Solidarity Fund for Africa: This is a combined collection with 50% of the funds collected going towards each cause. The first cause seeks to meet the needs of rebuilding the Church. It focuses on training seminarians and lay leaders, supporting social service programs, youth ministry, pastoral and catechetical centers, schools, church construction and renovation, and evangelization through Catholic media. The second cause is our opportunity to support the faith of our African brothers and sisters.

March 9—Native American and Black Missions: This collection continues as the embodiment of the Church's concern for evangelizing the Black and Native American peoples of the United States. The funds are distributed as grants to dioceses throughout the United States, supporting and strengthening evangelization programs that otherwise would cease. This Collection was formerly known as The Black and Indian Home Mission Collection.




Lent will begin next Wednesday, March 5. There will be times for Confessions, Stations of the Cross, Simple Suppers, and Masses during the weeks of Lent, as you can see in this bulletin. But perhaps the more important opportunities are those we create for ourselves, opportunities to practice the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, opportunities for sacrifices and other acts of mortification, opportunities to reflect on where our life is really leading us and decide about taking a new direction back to the Lord and to one another. These final days leading up to Lent are the time to give some thought to all those possibilities.

Beginning on Tuesday, March 4, I will be adding an additional time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation at St. Gregory the Great in Gray, from 5:30-6:30 pm. Fr. Peter, Fr. Paul, and I will rotate each week. We will offer this time through Lent and Easter and then do a re-evaluation.

Also, for Lent this year, we will once again be undertaking a parish spiritual read. I have selected Bishop Barron's Introduction to Prayer. Prayer fascinates us. Studies show that even atheists and agnostics sometimes pray. But what precisely is prayer? How does it "work"? And what are some of the time-tested ways to practice it? This book offers a collection of rich yet brief reflections on prayer in the Catholic spiritual tradition from acclaimed author, speaker, and theologian Bishop Robert Barron. This book explores the answers to questions like: Why should I pray?, What should I say or do when I'm praying?, Who exactly am I praying to?, Are there different types of prayer?, What do the spiritual masters say about prayer?, How can I establish a solid routine of prayer?, And many more. I hope that this book will inspire us to seek out more frequent conversation, and a deeper communion with God, not only through Lent, but beyond.

FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

FRIENDSHIP WITH JESUS Part III—Jesus Loves Me and He's Always There

As I became closer with Jesus and got to know Him more, I learned more about Him. One of the key lessons that came through was that Jesus loves me.

It sounds obvious, but the reality was more profound than I had expected. I had heard people tell me Jesus loved me before, but it was abstract to me. "Of course Jesus loves me, since God is Love and Jesus is God. That's just what Jesus does." As I got to know Jesus, it wasn't just a concept anymore. I began to notice how good He was to me and how much He took care of me. He put wonderful people in my life in my family and my friends. Everything I needed He provided for me, from a Catholic education, to grace when I was down to the wire finishing a project, to encounters with



people and experiences that happened right when I needed them most. Like a good friend, Jesus really cared for me and was there for me.

Second: Jesus loves me, yes I know, but that doesn't always mean He's gentle and warm. Have you ever had those friends who know you well enough to tell it to you straight when you're screwing up? Why do they do that? Because they care for you too much let you keep going as you are. It is the same way with Jesus. Jesus cares for you too much to sit by passively while you throw your life away. He loves you enough to be warm and kind when you need comforting, but He also loves you enough to tell you to smarten up when you need a wakeup call. It's hard to hear in the moment, but it's a sign of a true friend.

The third thing I learned about Jesus: He's always there. Friends are people you can count on, who will stand by you until the bitter end. Jesus is that friend par excellence. Even the best of human friends can flake out on you sometimes, but Jesus never does. I know I can always find Jesus waiting for me in the tabernacle, ready to listen, to help, to guide me. He was the first person I came to when I got accepted to college, the first person I went to when one of my friends passed away, the first person I went to when I was struggling to keep afloat with my school work. No matter what was going on, He was someone Whom I could turn to, Who would be there for me.

I encourage you to get to know this Jesus Christ. He's there waiting for you; you just have to get to know Him. It can be as simple as starting a conversation. Some of you think this is nuts, but I encourage you to give it a try. Go, speak to Him. It's a chance for you to meet the greatest friend you'll ever know.


