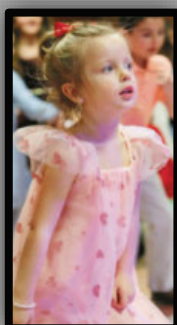

UPCOMING SECOND COLLECTIONS

March 5—Church in Eastern Europe and Solidarity Fund for Africa: This is a combined collection with 50% of the funds going towards each cause. The first cause seeks to meet the needs of rebuilding the Church. It focuses on training seminarians and lay leaders, supporting social services, youth ministry, pastoral and catechetical centers, schools, church construction and renovation, and evangelization through Catholic media. The second cause is our opportunity to support the faith of our African brothers and sisters.

March 9—Native American and Black Missions: This collection is the embodiment of the Church's concern for evangelizing the Black and Native American peoples of the United States. Funds are distributed as grants throughout the United States supporting evangelization programs that otherwise would cease. ***NOTE:** If you receive offertory envelopes, please note the date for this collection was misprinted as February 23. The correct date is March 9. Envelopes received to date will be applied to this collection.

HAITI UPDATES! After an absence due to the unrest in Haiti, Sr. Wanda and her colleagues were able to return to the Cyvadier Community Center in Jacmel and resume their ministry with the local children. In a note sent on February 2, 2025 Sr. Wanda reports: *"As you know, we are in Jacmel. We met with the children and shared a meal with them. They are very happy and excited. We hope to continue counting on your support to be able to continue working with them. Blessings, Sr. Wanda Morobel."* Thanks to your generous donations, POTHE was instrumental in building the Community Center in 2015 and continues to provide quarterly support for the Center.

PASTOR'S PONDEROSA



My dear parishioners,

We are getting ready to enter the holy season of Lent. Now is the time to commit yourself to specific Lenten practices. The three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We have many opportunities for times of prayer together. I am thinking of the nine daily Masses that will be offered on weekdays, the four occasions each week for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the three times on Fridays when we pray the Stations of the Cross, as well as the many hours available for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

In addition, I think some of the most important Lenten practices are those we adopt at **home**. Lent might be the time to begin saying grace together as a family before meals. Perhaps it is the time to reintroduce prayers before bed with your children. Maybe your family wants to make a commitment to pray the Rosary on a certain day. The easiest prayer is thanking God every morning for all blessings received and spending time each evening praying for the needs of other people. That is always a good place to start.

Finally, because we don't eat meat on Fridays during Lent, your family will notice there is something different about this season. The small voluntary **sacrifices** we make during Lent help us make bigger sacrifices demanded of us throughout our lives. May the Lord bless your observance of Lent.

I ask that you keep our **catechumens and candidates** in your daily prayers. As catechumens and candidates enter into the final period of preparation into full communion with the Catholic Church, the Order of Christian Initiation (OCIA), provides a number of rites to assist them. "This is a period of more intense spiritual preparation, consisting more in interior reflection than in catechetical instruction, and is intended to purify the minds and hearts of the elect as they search their own consciences and do penance. This period is intended as well to enlighten the minds and hearts of the elect with a deeper knowledge of Christ the Savior. The celebration of certain rites, particularly the scrutinies and the presentations, brings about this process of purification and enlightenment and extends it over the course of the entire Lenten season" (RCIA, n.139).

Today, at the 8:30 am Mass at Holy Martyrs, we will have the **Rite of Sending**. This rite offers our parish the opportunity to express its approval of the catechumens and to send them forth to the celebration of Election assured of the parish's care and support.

On Sunday, March 11, the **Rite of Election** will take place at the Cathedral with Bishop Ruggieri. On the basis of the testimony of godparents, catechists, and of the catechumens' reaffirmation of their intention, the Church judges their state of readiness and decides on their advancement toward the sacraments of initiation. Thus, the Church makes its **election**—the choice and admission of those catechumens who have the dispositions that make them fit to take part in the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. —Fr. Cartwright

MUSINGS ON THE ORATORY PART 1

A HOME, CHURCH, SCHOOL, AND PLAYGROUND

During the Fall, I offered a series of reflections on Family Religious Education in our parish (FIRE). For the next few weeks, I will do something similar for our middle school and high school program known as the Oratory.

The inspiration for the Oratory came from St. Don Bosco's "Oratory." It was a group of poor teenage boys in Italy who followed Don Bosco around as their catechist and pastor. It began with him teaching catechesis to poor children. As his reputation for being a kind and fatherly figure grew, the group grew into the hundreds. In Don Bosco's Oratory, there was fun, there was prayer, and there was learning. The way the Salesians today sum it up is that Oratory is to be a "home, school, church, and playground." It produced great saints like St. Dominic Savio and converted the hearts of would-be sinners like Mickey Magone.

This mix of solid catechesis and joy intrigued me. I had spent time in youth ministry after college and had seen different models. On the one hand, I had seen groups that were lots of fun with good numbers, that didn't do much catechesis. They had retreats, and some of the teens had powerful experiences in those retreats. Nevertheless, so many of the teens we worked with fell away from the faith in the years after. It was clear to me that they needed stronger foundations in the faith than we had provided, because when challenged, the foundations we supplied didn't hold.

On the other hand, I had seen attempts to stick strictly to classroom catechesis. This had its pitfalls too. Numbers tended to be low and it was hard to get the teens engaged. The youth group model (at its best) gave the catechist a chance to build a rapport of trust with the teens and the teens to build a rapport with each other. Once that's established, a lot can be accomplished, but (as much as my teacher heart hates to admit it) it tends to happen through activities outside the classroom.

The faith of the Oratory flourished under Don Bosco because the teens trusted him. They also trusted each other. There was a sense of camaraderie in the Oratory that bound them together. They learnt together of course, but these boys also prayed together and even sang together. Among strangers these things would be unbearably awkward, but in the Oratory they weren't among strangers: they were among brothers and friends.

In Don Bosco's Oratory, the boys came for catechesis and to pray, but Don Bosco breathed such a spirit of charity and joy into that place that it also became a home for them and a place where they had fun. It was my hope when we started the Oratory here that somehow, we could capture some of the spirit that Don Bosco managed to capture.

NEW ADDITION TO CONFESSION SCHEDULE: This Lent, our faithful priests are providing another weekly opportunity for us to experience the healing Sacrament of Reconciliation. Together with Saturdays, Confessions will be offered at St. Gregory the Great from 5:30 - 6:30 pm every Tuesday beginning March 11. There will also be added opportunities for Confession during *The Light is on for You* scheduled for April 7-10 (more details coming later).

ADORATION REMINDER: Adoration is a time to sit in silent and peaceful prayer with Jesus exposed in the Blessed Sacrament. POTHE offers Adoration four times a week, once at each church as follows: Monday 12-8 pm at Holy Martyrs, Fridays 8:30-9:30 am at St. Gregory the Great, 3-6 pm at St. Jude, and Saturdays 8:45 -9:45 am at Sacred Heart.

PARISH READ: We will once again be undertaking a parish spiritual read. Fr. Cartwright selected Bishop Barron's *Introduction to Prayer*. This book offers a collection of rich yet brief reflections on prayer in the Catholic spiritual tradition from acclaimed author, speaker, and theologian, Bishop Robert Barron. This book explores the answers to questions like: Why should I pray?, What should I say or do when I'm praying?, Who exactly am I praying to?, Are there different types of prayer?, What do the spiritual masters say about prayer?, How can I establish a solid routine of prayer?, And many more. THINGS PERHAPS FORGOTTEN ABOUT FASTING: Those who are between the ages of 18-59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting consists of one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to one full meal. Those who are age 14 and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent.
