

YOUTH SCHOLA ATTENDS PUERI CANTORES FESTIVAL IN BOSTON:

Our POTHE Youth Schola was one of sixteen choirs participating in the festival. After a day of rehearsing, the children sang at a Mass at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston. Heidi Pyle and Eleanor Gwarjanski, led by our Director of Sacred Music, Jennifer Runge, were among the over 250 students and choir directors chanting and singing sacred music from a repertoire ranging from Mozart to Theodore Marier to Giuseppe Pitoni. The Corpus Christi Watershed blog captured the hope and excitement from the event in their March 11 post, "Many had not sung much chant—to say nothing of a Latin INTROIT from the *Graduale Romanum*. But with mutual support, preparation, and opportunity, children are capable of most anything. PASTOR'S PONDEROSA



My dear parishioners,

Three weeks in, I hope that your **Lent** is going well. Here are more suggestions for making this Lent different for you and your family: **Practice forgiveness.** Just as you examine your own conscience and ask for absolution, make an effort to forgive others. **Invite a friend to church.** Make a special effort during Lent to share your faith with others. Practice one-on-one invitations to discover the faith. **Focus on faith for 40 days.** Be more aware of your daily choices. What do you watch on television? What music are you listening to? What books and magazines are you reading? What websites are you visiting? Ask yourself, "Is what I am consuming nourishing my soul?" **Add goodness to your life.** Identify something negative in your life and work to change it or replace it with something positive. **Live simply and add peace to your life.** Unplug or limit access to electronics. Slow your schedule down and focus on the things that really matter, your faith, family, and helping others.

This week, parishioners at Holy Martyrs will be noticing quite a change. **Dave's World** will be in to complete the installation of heat pumps in the narthex, Pastor's office, and parish hall. For the past seven months, a dedicated group of generous parishioners have helped us make this project a reality, by raising close to \$40,000 for the project. You may remember that heat pumps were installed in the church a couple of months ago and the office was completed almost three years ago. This initiative could not have happened if it were not for David Spellman. David and I have worked closely since my arrival to ensure that this finally happened. I am enormously grateful for his leadership, extensive communication, and enthusiasm, as well as for the donors who contributed in any way. In addition to taking enormous pressure off the aging boiler in the winter, we now have three churches in our parish that have air conditioning for the summer!

POTHE MEN, I personally invite you to consider attending the **ACTS Retreat, April 24-27.** I was first introduced to the ACTS community as a newly ordained priest ten years ago in Lewiston. I had absolutely no idea what I was getting into, but I'm glad that I did. I have watched this retreat change men's and women's lives for the better! Please consider taking some time away with other men to grow in your faith as well as your personal relationship with Our Lord. Also, please do not let the cost of the retreat keep you away, as scholarship funds are available. For more information and to register, please visit pothe.org/acts-retreat.

Lastly, please look ahead at the schedules of Masses for **Easter, April 19-20.** Please note that the **ONLY** Mass to be celebrated Saturday, April 19, the Eve of Easter, will be at 8:00 pm, the Easter Vigil at Sacred Heart. Called to Discipleship ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

MUSINGS ON THE ORATORY—PART 4 PRAYER

Every Oratory night concludes with prayer. To be honest, this was the part of the night that I wasn't sure about when we started. In time, I've come to be very impressed by the way our teens conduct themselves during this last part of the Oratory.

Strictly speaking, *oratory* means a house of prayer, a place where people pray together. In the end, all the learning and activities we do are aimed at one thing: to point the teens to Jesus Christ. Night Prayer is when the rubber hits the road. The God they have been learning about has been waiting for them in the tabernacle upstairs in the church that whole time, and now we are going to see Him.

As the middle schoolers file into the church from the rectory and the high schoolers come up the stairs from the hall, hats are off, the teens genuflect before the tabernacle and take a pew. While the candles are lit by teen volunteers on the altar, everyone waits and prays in silence.

Night Prayer begins with an examination of conscience.

The idea is that at the end of the day, we should take a moment to examine how we conducted ourselves. Did



we cooperate with God's grace? Did we spend our day in His service for His greater glory? And if we didn't, it's a chance to acknowledge that before Him and resolve with His grace to do better the next day.

After the examination of conscience, the psalms and hymns of Night Prayer reflect on the theme of entrusting yourself to God's protection as you end your day and prepare to go to sleep. There is a kind of rhythm to the way the psalms are recited (we call this praying "antiphonally") and over the last 2 years the teens have gotten the hang of it. Whereas before I would hear the occasional muttered response, now I hear most of the teens responding and even singing at the hymn. It's a beautiful and peaceful end to the night.

Don Bosco set out to make the Oratory a home, a church, a school, and a playground. Our Oratory is still in its infant stages, but I think it has grown a lot towards that end. Certainly our teens have grown and we are very proud of them. More are welcome! We meet two Sundays a month from 5-7 pm at Sacred Heart Church. Fasting consists of one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to one full meal. Those who are age 14 and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent.
