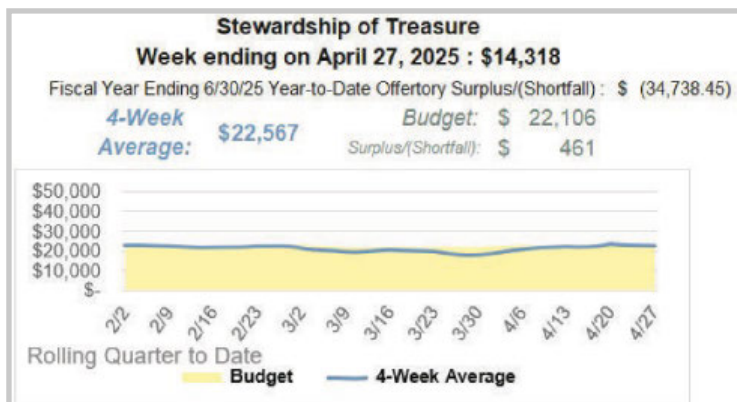

2025 DIOCESAN CATHOLIC APPEAL: Last weekend was my initial invitation to participate in the **2025 Annual Catholic Appeal**. Many of you have already received information in the mail. The Annual Appeal funds the operations of the Diocese, much like the weekly collections funds the operations of the parish. You have shown yourselves to be very generous each year in support of this appeal. In fact, last year the average gift was about \$950 per family! That is amazingly impressive! We were ninth in terms of the total number of families making gifts. That also is very good. The 2025 goal for the Parish of the Holy Eucharist set by the diocese is \$403,816.32. This year I would like us not only to achieve our financial goal, but I would like to **contribute over 400 individual gifts to the appeal**. Last year we were so close, as you gave 365 gifts. I am optimistic and hopeful that we can achieve this together. Every single dollar matters. Every single gift matters. PASTOR'S PONDEROSA

Dear Parishioners,



A very happy Memorial Day weekend to all of you! We take this opportunity to remember all those who died in service to our country over the years. We thank those who are currently serving in our armed forces, especially those who are far from home. May God bless them and protect them! Please join us for **9 am Mass at Holy Cross Cemetery**. This is an occasion to pray for the dead. Catholic cemeteries are the principal way the Catholic community lives out the corporal and spiritual works of mercy of burying the dead and praying for the dead. They are a witness to our belief in the Resurrection of the body on the last day. They are sacred places, like our churches, where our prayer makes holy the locations set aside for these purposes. Memorial Day is an occasion to remind ourselves of the role that Catholic cemeteries play in the life of the Church.

This coming Thursday, we will celebrate the **Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord**. It is a holy day of obligation, meaning we attend Mass on this day as we would on a Sunday. The entire schedule of Masses, beginning Wednesday night and continuing through the day Thursday is printed here. Please make plans now with your family regarding which Mass you will be able to attend.

The Ascension of Our Lord is not just the end of Jesus' time on Earth. It's also a turning point for the Church, and a sign of what comes next in the Christian story. Here are three key messages behind the Ascension: (1.) Jesus Completes His Work on Earth. The Ascension marks the completion of Jesus' mission. He came to teach, to heal, to suffer, die and rise again. After His Resurrection, His final act was to return to the Father. This signals that His saving work was done. (2.) He Opens Heaven to Us. By returning to Heaven, Jesus opens the way for all who follow Him. The Ascension is a sign of hope that eternal life is possible. He goes to prepare a place for His followers (John 14:2-3). (3.) The Mission Continues Before ascending, Jesus gave His apostles a mission: to go and make disciples of all nations. The Church begins to take shape here. He promises the Holy Spirit, who will guide and empower His followers to carry out this mission. That promise is fulfilled at Pentecost, 10 days later.

As we will soon be welcoming Fr. Joseph Jum, we also say thank you and goodbye to Fr. Paul. Please mark your calendar on **Tuesday, June 24, at Holy Martyrs hall** for a parish-wide thank you and send off for Fr. Paul who has faithfully served POTHE for 7 ½ years. Doors will open at 5:30 pm and dinner will be served at 6:00 pm. We will be taking RSVPs (due by Monday, June 16) so we have the right number of seats and amount of food. Please come and thank Fr. Paul for all he has done!

FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

LIFE VIEWED FROM YOUR DEATHBED

PART 3

Since that day in India, I did recover (as you can all plainly see) and I have since tried to live my life in accord with that insight, that there is nothing to lose and everything to gain in telling people about Jesus Christ and the way to heaven. Granted, the particulars of where that has taken me have been embarrassingly varied. Nonetheless, in all the ups and downs and moves and name changes, that perspective I gained from that glimpse at my own mortality has remained. What Christ taught us was true. People need to know what He taught, because Heaven depends on it.

That is not to say it has always been easy. Helping people on the way to heaven means both telling them things are pleasant to hear and also things that are frankly uncomfortable. It means the joys of sharing someone's excitement and regularly putting yourself in a position of possibly being rejected.

I think all of you realize this. I share this with you to encourage you that when you are faced with an uncomfortable situation where you have to talk about chastity, judgment, sin, or the truth of the Catholic faith with someone who does not want to hear it, put it in its eternal perspective. If that person gets upset now, they will not be upset if it helps them in eternity. If you feel uncomfortable now, it will pale compared to the joy you will experience in eternity if there was even a chance that it could help that person on the way to heaven.

I encourage you to consider your own life. If you were looking back on your life from the perspective of your deathbed, what decisions would you have wished you had made today? Do not worry about those decisions that you made years ago that you wish you could change. In light of eternity, how would you want to play your cards now?

I have the privilege in this job of working with young people who are preparing to make some key life decisions. When I was here as a seminarian in 2018, I taught a homeschool apologetics course. Those students are now in their early twenties and are starting to make major decisions. Each has chosen a different course, but many of them are making decisions with eternity in mind. Two have gotten married this year, two others have discerned religious life and a third will be receiving her religious name as a religious sister in the Children of Mary (i.e. becoming a nun).

Considering eternity need not mean you become a parish Director of Religious Education. The point is that God can do beautiful things with our lives if we let Him. The key is to remember that our lives are on loan from Him, and that our purpose is to labor for His greater glory, whatever shape that might take.

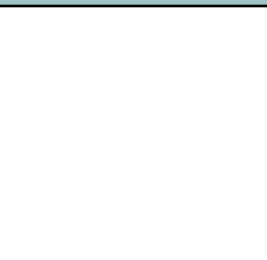
