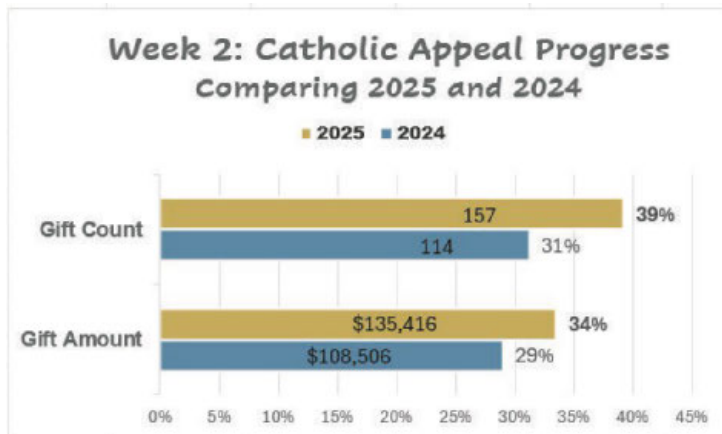

PASTOR'S PONDEROSA



Dear Parishioners,

Next weekend, June 21-22 will be the **Patronal Solemnity of our Parish of the Holy Eucharist, Corpus Christi**. A reminder that both the 8 am and 11 am Masses at Sacred Heart will be **COMBINED to make one 10 am Solemn Parish Mass and Eucharistic Procession**. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the whole Christian life. A Eucharistic procession, therefore, is a public witness of the veneration toward the most holy Eucharist, conducted through public streets. This earthly journey reminds the Catholic faithful of their spiritual journey toward eternal life with God.

For some months now, you may have been to a Mass in which you've seen Joe or another altar server wielding what looks like a brass disc on a stick (*we have one like that at Holy Martyrs and Sacred Heart*) or a double handled brass plate (*at St. Jude and St. Gregory the Great*). In both cases, the function is the same.

This device is called a chin paten. It used to be standard for administering communion in Catholic churches and fell into general disuse in recent decades. In 2004, the Congregation for Divine Worship recommended it be revived in the document, *Redemptionis Sacramentum*. The purpose of the chin paten is to guard against a host or any particles of a host falling to the ground. Every Sacred Host and every particle of the host is Jesus, so it's important that should any particles fall, they are caught on the paten. This little extra step is one more way to show love and reverence for Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament by being careful with Him.

With that said, I've seen enough confused looks in the communion line to think some explanation and trouble shooting might be in order. First, please know that just because we're using the chin paten does not mean you are required to receive on the tongue. While this is how the chin paten was traditionally used, if you wish to receive on the hands, we will simply put the paten under your hands rather than your chin.

Considering that, please remember that the server must make a quick decision on whether to put the paten under your chin or your hands. It is helpful to indicate which way you wish to receive before you approach the priest. If you're receiving on the hand, please have your hands out before the priest says, "The Body of Christ." If your hands are folded when the priest says, "The Body of Christ," the assumption is that you're receiving on the tongue. If there's confusion, please don't be embarrassed. These things happen.

As of now, we do not use the chin paten at every Mass. In time, it will get more use as we get more accustomed to it. Like our use of ablution cups for Eucharistic Ministers or the procedures altar servers use for folding corporals, this is just one more way to show extra reverence for every particle of Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

There are still several green cards in each church with the QR code directing you to the website to take the inventory. May the Holy Spirit guide all of us to serve the Lord, the Church, the Parish, and each other!

FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

THE PARADOX OF JESUS

Last week, we talk about how Jesus Christ is infinitely loving and merciful and also infinitely powerful and just. To neglect any of these qualities is to entirely miss who He really is. For people who have not encountered Jesus, this sounds paradoxical. How could the same man be the one everyone fears and also everyone loves?

C.S. Lewis did us a service in holding both together in the character of Aslan the Lion, but that paradox shines through clearly when you read the New Testament.

I think of this when I read how Our Lord appeared to St. John in the beginning of the book of Revelation. St. John, the beloved disciple, who leaned his head against Our Lord's heart at the Last Supper, who saw Him draw massive crowds by His deep goodness and love, says that when Jesus appeared to him in a vision on the island of Patmos, "I fell at His feet as one dead." (Revelation 1:17) And no wonder. Our Lord appeared to Him in all His glory, with eyes like blazing fire, feet like bronze glowing in the furnace, face blazing like the sun, and a sharp two edged sword coming out of His mouth.



And yet this is the same Jesus that St. John knew in 30 AD when they were preaching in Galilee. He approaches John, places His right hand on John's shoulder and says, "Do not be afraid." In the same person, He is both almighty God, judge of the whole human race, creator of the universe, and Love Himself, infinite goodness and mercy.

"Do not be afraid." That phrase sums up the paradox in the Gospels. When Christ appears to the disciples walking on water, He has to tell them not to be afraid, because the natural reaction to such power is fear. It is the very paradox we find in Aslan the Lion: power that inspires fear, but deep goodness behind it that inspires trust.

I once had a professor of literature whose field of expertise was horror. He used to say that a monster is a creature you cannot control. That is why we are afraid of monsters: because we are at their mercy. No one fears an ant (as much as you might not like them) but everyone fears a bear. We can control the ant; without proper ammunition and good aim, we'd be hard pressed to control the bear.

Our Lord is no monster, but I think that principle that we fear what we cannot control explains the reactions of those who glimpse His divinity. As C.S. Lewis writes about Aslan, "He is not a tame lion." God is good, infinitely good, worthy of our trust, but infinitely more powerful than us and out of our control. We can know how we will act, we can trust Him, but we cannot make Him conform to our designs. Deep love but also a kind of awe and respect are the proper reaction before such a God.

Boxes to be used to build a "cave entrance" to Holy Martyrs Hall. Boxes need to be approximately 17" x 11" x 12" or slightly larger.

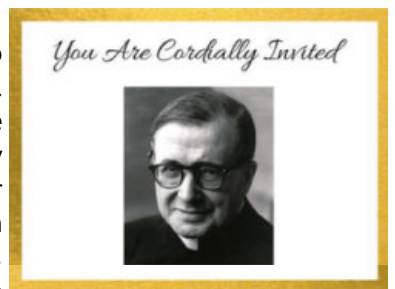
