






Called to Discipleship ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

Sharing God's Word ~ Through Faith Formation and Pastoral Life

FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR DEPICTING JESUS CHRIST IN ART

Some of you know that I have been particular about artwork since I arrived here. In the modern era, there is a tendency to want to domesticate Christ. There are lots of depictions of Christ that show Him loving and approachable, but also merely human. By merely human, I mean that you get no sense from the depictions that this was the God-man. In the textbooks I used growing up, the depictions of Jesus gave you the impression that He was nothing special. The artwork was plain, people only had one reaction to Him (all smiles). I remember thinking in middle school that not only was Jesus just alright (as the Doobie Brothers song put it), but He seemed lame. What was the big deal?

This is one of the reasons why I love Baroque paintings. They seem to have a power to capture the various movements of the heart before Jesus Christ: awe, reverence, love, contrition, and all sorts of other intense emotions when you behold the Incarnate God. Munich stained glass has the same effect. Next time you go to visit the cathedral in Portland, take some time to study the faces and reactions of the various characters in the scenes. Their reactions tell you a lot about what Jesus Christ is like in reality as they interact with Him.

You will notice that the reactions are more complicated than simple smiles. Take the Cross, for instance. You will find joy in the faces of Mary Magdalene, St. John, and Our Lady at the foot of the cross as they witness the greatest act of love humanity has ever known: Jesus Christ laying down His life as ransom for our sins. But of course, it is not pure joy they experience. There is also sorrow, and contrition (at least on the part of St. John and Mary Magdalene). This is what my sins have done! And Our Lord would still love me enough to pay such a terrible price for me.

Look at the expression of Our Lady at the Annunciation. Of course there is joy at being told that she will bear the Son of God, the Savior of the world. But there is more going on than that. There is fear and awe before God's messenger, a sense of the weight and responsibility that is being entrusted to her, a burning love for God, and an intense humility before Him. All these dynamics are wrapped up into one scene.

Reducing Jesus to just a nice guy whom everyone likes distorts who Jesus Christ was and is. The halos, the awe and reverence, the more complicated reactions of those around Him are important to depict, because they speak to who He is. Art has the power to teach, and it is important that whatever it teaches be in accord with what we believe.
