



PASTOR'S PONDEROSA

Dear Parishioners,

A heartfelt thank you to all who took the time to come to Fr. Paul's going-away dinner this past week. It was a wonderful gathering that I am sure touched Fr. Paul deeply. Thank

you to all who helped and assisted in any way, setting up, gathering and cooking food, decorations, taking down. As his brother priest, I am grateful to him for all the support he has given me in my first pastorate over these past years.

A large thank you to all who helped make our patronal solemnity of Corpus Christi so beautiful and reverent throughout our parish, from our musicians, servers, lectors, sacristans, and extraordinary ministers to all who spent time with our Lord as a Eucharistic Guardian and to all who helped witness to the Town of Yarmouth in our Eucharistic Procession. I know many people were involved, so once again, I thank you enormously.

As we are preparing for a time of transition for our parish, I would like to thank those of you who have taken the time to offer me your understanding and support in making a difficult decision. Although some may no longer have access to their preferred time and place for Mass, a parish is first and foremost a community of the Christian faithful that exists in a particular area. More beautiful than any building is the work God does in our souls through the gifts of His Holy Spirit. Even when the normal time and place of worship of a community may change, the gifts with which God has endowed that community are not lost: "For the gifts and the call of God are irrevocable" (Romans 11:29); indeed, the gifts of all remain necessary for the building up of the body of Christ, the Church. I hope that the gifts God has given to His people here at POTHE will continue to bear abundant fruit.

Lastly, today we get to celebrate something that happens only once every seven years. June 29 is the combined celebration of Saints Peter and Paul, both apostles and martyrs. Saints Peter and Paul are considered the foundational pillars of the Church. Peter represents the stability of the Church and the office of the Vicar of Christ. Paul represents the mission of evangelization that was entrusted to the Church by Jesus Himself. Their twin martyrdom reminds us that the Church must be both stable and mission oriented. It must remain grounded in the ancient Truth yet grow and flower with an ongoing understanding of the mysteries of faith.

As we honor these two pillars of the Church, recall that, though they are great saints, they were also ordinary men called to extraordinary vocations. They responded, and God used them in ways they could have never imagined. Ponder your own calling considering theirs and resolve to lay your life down for the Church, joining yourself to these two men so that God can continue their holy mission through you.

FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

OF SNEAKERS AND SCANDAL

Part of being a competitive swimmer was going to dryland workouts. For most sports, "dryland" goes without saying. (Holding a basketball practice in Back Bay would be odd indeed). But for swimmers, we had to make a special point to run, do squats, situps, and pushups and other sweat breaking activities twice a week to build up muscles that our time in the pool may not account for.

In the beginning, these workouts took place on a patch of grass across from the pool parking lot. In time, they moved to a local gym. Precisely because I was a swimmer, going to a gym was a novelty. The rules, decorum, and expectations of the institution were all new.

On the first day, we were told that street shoes were not allowed. Any rocks we tracked in were liable to scratch the wooden floor on which we were working out. I heard the rule and understood the logic and went home to find something suitable.

My school shoes were out of the question. My running shoes looked suitable, but I used them for running cross country which was outside by definition. However, I had a pair of sneakers that hadn't been used for almost a year. They were old and holes were starting to wear in them. Plus, I had used them when I was digging a new cellar for our camp the past three summers. The digging project had stained them permanently brown, but they were otherwise clean and were never worn on the street. That seemed to fit the rule.

When I showed up with them, our dryland coach was not impressed. "You can't have street shoes in here." "But these aren't street shoes." Looking at the dirt colored shoes, my coach replied, "Yeah, right." I had to find something different.



At the time, I was ready to defend my case and how they really did fit the criteria, but looking back, this was an early lesson for me in the way in which appearances really do matter. Even though my shoes were technically not street shoes, no one would believe that by their appearance. As far as enforcing the rule, it would give everyone else in the gym the clear impression that street shoes were allowed. It wasn't enough that they weren't street shoes in reality, they needed to be that way in appearance.

The same is true with our moral lives. For instance, when you appear to have lied (but technically didn't). Or when you spend too much one on one time with someone of the opposite sex who is not your spouse. Your actions may actually be within moral boundaries, but if the appearance doesn't line up with that, there's still a problem. We call it scandal. Our example can lead other people into sin; it is important that we remember that the appearance of sin can do that just as effectively as the reality of it.
