PASTOR'S PONDEROSA

Dear Parishioners,



For several weeks now, the Parish of the Holy Eucharist has lead the way with the most money raised for this year's Catholic Appeal. That is tremendous! You are to be congratulated for your generosity. Last year, about 360 families made a gift to the Appeal, and our goal this year is 400 gifts. So far this year, about 274 families have given. That is very good. If your family has not yet made some kind of gift toward the annual Appeal, there are still envelopes for that purpose on the sides of all the pews of the parish. I encourage every family to consider making a gift according to your means. Thank you very much for your sacrifices and for your support.

Vacation Bible Camp is taking place this coming week, July 14-18. The camp will be held at Holy Martyrs in Falmouth. Please be advised that the regularly scheduled daily Mass at 7:30 am on Friday, July 18, will be moved to 11:00 am with our campers and their families.

The Yarmouth Clam Festival will be taking place next weekend. Please consider signing up and volunteering for this wonderful event. Please be advised that due to the annual bike race, there will be NO 11:00 am Sacred Heart Mass on Sunday, July 20.

Locally, Our Shepherd, Bishop Ruggieri, has recently promulgated new Instructions *On the Manner of Distributing Holy Communion Outside of Mass by an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion* and *On the Manner of Distributing Holy Communion During Mass for the Diocese of Portland*, which take effect on August 1, 2025. These norms have been promulgated by Bishop Ruggieri following consultation with the Presbyteral Council and the Vicariates of the Diocese. These norms are intended to foster greater clarity and consistency in our liturgical practice across the Diocese. As a result of these new norms, there will be a mandatory meeting for all Extraordinary Ministers of the parish on Tuesday, July 22 at Sacred Heart in Yarmouth from 6-7 pm. You may choose to attend in person or online. This meeting will cover the changes in protocols that Bishop Ruggieri is implementing throughout the Diocese. Further details of the meeting will be coming soon.

Lastly, you may not be aware that nearly 100 American men and women from the United States are currently being considered for sainthood. Many Catholics hope that Pope Leo XIV, the first U.S.-born pope, will soon beatify or canonize some new American saints, perhaps even the first African American saint. 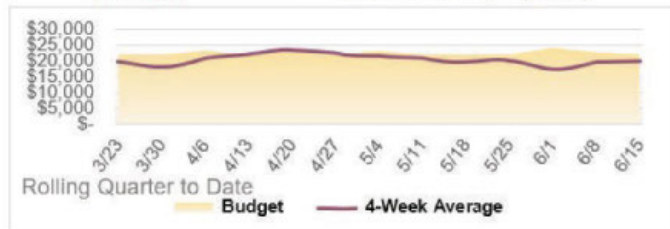

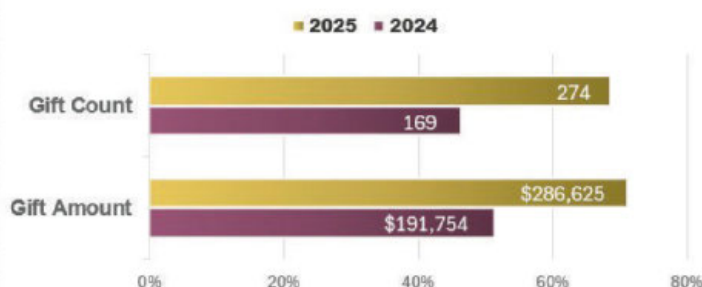

FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

LIVING WITH INTEGRITY

There was a joke I thought was great when I was a kid. "If you're an American when you go into the bathroom, and you're an American when you come out of the bathroom..." I'm afraid the full joke is probably a little sophomoric for a church bulletin column. Point being, that opening line came to mind when talking about Confirmation this week. "If you're a Catholic when you go into Church, and you're a Catholic when you come out of Church then what are you at work? At the polls? At home? Among your friends?"

The American relationship to religion in public life can be strange to say the least. I remember in college, there was a kind of social expectation that the minute you stepped into a classroom (mind you, this was at a Catholic school) you had to think like an atheist. Within the walls of the church, God was real, the Commandments were binding, and Heaven was all that was worth pursuing, but within the walls of a school building, none of that was to be mentioned, alluded to, or included for consideration. Perhaps such topics wouldn't come up if you were majoring in chemistry, but I was studying philosophy, so this came up frequently. Classmates who were Catholic in other contexts were acting like atheists as students; in their minds, they were just doing what was expected of them.

I think because of the Jeffersonian ideals of "separation of church and state," Americans take it for granted that they should hold one set of beliefs in church and then operate on a totally different paradigm in public. But this Jekyll and Hyde way of life is absurd if you seriously consider the claims of the faith. We are claiming that God, angels, the immortal soul, Heaven, and hell are as real as Janet Mills (to pick a random example.) Just as Janet Mills does not stop existing once you leave the Statehouse, God does not cease to exist as soon as you leave church; the reality is you're liable to run into either on the street and should play your cards accordingly.

In the sacrament of Confirmation, a cross is traced on the forehead of the one being confirmed. The confirmandi is to imagine that from here on out, that cross is visible to everyone they meet. No matter what the social norms might be, we are to live in such a way that all know that we are Catholic by our words and our actions. If Christ and the Apostles are credible, you must play your cards accordingly. To do otherwise would be like driving off a cliff because it was socially fashionable to deny the law of gravity. Whatever the social norms might be, if the law of gravity is real, we better act accordingly or suffer a rough landing. The same is true of the Faith. If the Faith is true, we need to play our cards accordingly, whether in private or in public. That's living with integrity.
