UPCOMING SECOND COLLECTIONS

PASTOR'S PONDEROSA

My Dear Parishioners,

Over these past days and weeks, I have found myself returning again and again to one simple truth: grace most often arrives clothed in the love of God's people. As many of you know, my mother, Lynn, was recently called into the arms of Our Lord. Her passing has been a profound and painful moment in my life, and yet, in the midst of that sorrow, I have been sustained in ways I could not have imagined, because of you.

I want to express, from the depths of my heart, my enormous gratitude for the overwhelming kindness you have shown to me. Attending my mother's Requiem Mass, the wonderful reception afterwards, your handwritten notes, your emails and texts, the Mass cards, the meals, the whispered promises of prayers, the hugs at the door of the church, the gifts, and the generous donations made in her memory to 75 State Street, every single gesture has touched me deeply. Each one has reminded me that grief, though heavy, is never carried alone when one belongs to a parish family as loving and faith-filled as ours.

As an only child, the loss of a parent carries a unique weight. There is an aloneness to it that is difficult to describe. And yet, you stepped directly into that space with tenderness and strength. You became, quite literally, a family to me. The Body of Christ is not an abstract theological phrase; it is a lived reality. I have seen it, felt it, and relied upon it these last weeks. Your compassion has been Christ's own mercy in action.

So often I stand before you as a pastor, striving to guide, to preach, to serve, to console. But in this season of grief, you have been the ones who have shepherded me. Your love has reminded me that the Church is at her most beautiful when she accompanies her children through sorrow with patience, gentleness, and faith. You have done that for me, and I will never forget it.

My mother was a woman of firm love and quiet strength. She would have been deeply moved to know that the parish her son serves responded with such generosity of heart. I have no doubt she would be grateful for the way you have cared for me.

Please know that every prayer, every word, every gesture, no matter how small, has mattered. I carry them with me. I pray for each of you with renewed affection, because you have shown me what it truly means to be a community formed by Christ's compassion.

From the bottom of my heart, thank you. Thank you for honoring my mother's memory. Thank you for standing beside me. Thank you for being my family.

May God reward your kindness a hundredfold, and may Our Lady, who knows the grief of a son who loves his mother, intercede for us always.

FROM OUR FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

THE SEVENTH COMMANDMENT: THOU SHALT NOT STEAL

The seventh commandment is "Thou shalt not steal." Most of those reading this probably have never been in the habit of burglary or highway robbery. Consequently, I am going to leave those obvious violations of property rights aside. It is the more subtle occasions for theft that I want to focus on here.

I remember when I was a teenager, it wasn't uncommon for people to illegally download music. I wasn't one of them, but I remember talking to my father about this at the kitchen table one night. I said something to the effect of, "At least no one's getting hurt." My dad replied, "It never ceases to amaze me that people, who would never think of breaking into a store, think nothing of stealing online. No matter how you got it, the reality is that it's not yours."

That line has stuck in my head over the years. I have heard people justify stealing in numerous ways. "How else am I going to afford it?" If you can't afford it, you shouldn't have it. That person you are stealing from has no obligation to give it to you. "The company will never miss it." Even still, it's not yours. "They have plenty of money. What's the difference?" It's still theirs and not yours to take.

At times, we can be callous about how we treat other people's things. Sometimes we forget that nothing comes from nothing: when people own things, it is because money, work, and labor went into buying and maintaining it. Not paying for parking sounds like no big deal, but someone is paying for the upkeep of that parking lot. I think of this often when it comes to vandalism. Someone works hard to keep up their house only to see it egged. Or the city works hard to keep our common spaces looking nice for us, only to see new signs and buildings painted with graffiti. Behind every theft or destruction of property, there is some owner who was trying to do some good with what they owned, and they have been wronged.

Lastly, we need to talk about what ownership means. In a world where it is common to subscribe, stream, or lease, we can forget that it is possible to actually own something. When you own something, you are free to dispose of it as you see fit. The moral law sets the limit for what you can do with your property. Of course, you should think about others. Be considerate of your neighbors, remember the poor, take care of your family, but as an owner, you have the freedom to decide how to use your resources to best accomplish that. Owners are more than mere tenants, which gives them great opportunity, but also great responsibility. Pope Leo XIII comments on this extensively in his encyclical *Rerum Novarum*. I highly recommend it.
