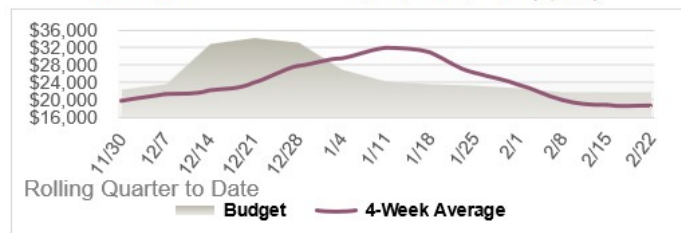

PASTOR'S PONDEROSA

My Dear Parishioners,

One of the greatest gifts that Christ has given to His Church is the Sacrament of Penance, more commonly known as Confession. Yet it is also one of the most misunderstood and underutilized sacraments in the life of many Catholics. During this week, the Light will be on for you! The Church invites us once again to rediscover the beauty and necessity of this sacrament of mercy.

On the evening of Easter Sunday, the risen Lord appeared to His apostles and gave them a remarkable gift. Breathing upon them, He said: "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20:22-23). In that moment Christ entrusted to His Church the authority to forgive sins in His name. Confession is therefore not simply a devotional practice or a spiritual counseling session. It is a sacrament instituted by Christ Himself through which the mercy of God is poured into the soul and the life of sanctifying grace is restored.

The Church takes this sacrament very seriously. The Code of Canon Law reminds us that the faithful have both the right and the responsibility to approach this sacrament regularly. Canon 960 teaches that "individual and integral confession and absolution constitute the only ordinary means by which a member of the faithful who is conscious of grave sin is reconciled with God and with the Church." In other words, when we are aware of serious sin, Confession is the ordinary way Christ has given us to return to Him. The Church also lovingly encourages us to make Confession a regular part of our spiritual lives. Canon 989 states that "after having reached the age of discretion, each member of the faithful is obliged to confess faithfully his or her grave sins at least once a year." While this is the minimum requirement, the saints and spiritual masters of the Church have always encouraged more frequent confession because of the tremendous grace it provides for spiritual growth.

Confession does three beautiful things in our lives. First, it restores our friendship with God by removing the burden of sin. Second, it heals the wounds of the soul and strengthens us to resist future temptation. Third, it gives us the profound experience of hearing the words of absolution, words that remind us that God's mercy is real, personal, and immediate. Many people hesitate to go to Confession because of fear or embarrassment. But the truth is that every priest who sits in the confessional does so not as a judge eager to condemn, but as a physician of souls eager to heal. There is no sin that God cannot forgive, no burden too heavy for His mercy.

This week, confessions will be heard from 6-7pm, March 23 at St. Gregory the Great, March 24 at Sacred Heart, March 25 at St. Jude and March 26 at Holy Martyrs. This is a beautiful opportunity to step into the confessional, perhaps after many years, and experience the freedom and peace that come from being reconciled with God. If it has been a long time since your last Confession, do not be afraid. Simply come. The light will be on, and Christ will be waiting for you.

HOLY WEEK IN OUR PARISH

TENEBRAE: On Wednesday, April 1, we will offer a *Tenebrae* service at Sacred Heart from 7-8 pm. *Tenebrae*, Latin for *darkness*, is an ancient liturgy traditionally celebrated within the last three days of Holy Week, ushering us into the darkness of Christ's Death. The service

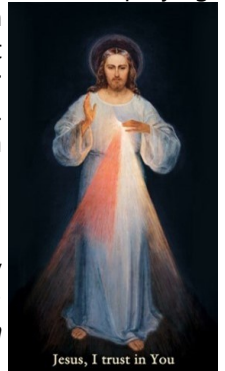


begins with all candles aflame on a candelabra. As chanted prayer begins, a candle is snuffed at the conclusion of each prayer until a single candle remains. Then the remaining lit candle is hidden, a final prayer is said in darkness, and the liturgy concludes with a loud noise called, the *strepitus*, symbolizing the death of Christ and the darkness that fell over the Earth. All leave in silence. It's a remarkable service and we hope you have the opportunity to join us.

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA: Please join the Parish in praying the Divine Mercy Novena that begins on Good Friday in preparation for the Feast Day of Divine Mercy Sunday, April 12. For each of the nine days, our Lord gave St. Faustina a different intention. The Novena and Chaplet will be prayed following all the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday, and following the daily morning Masses and scheduled Adoration from Easter Sunday to Divine Mercy Sunday. 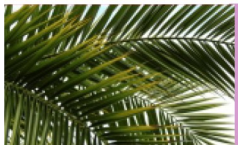
