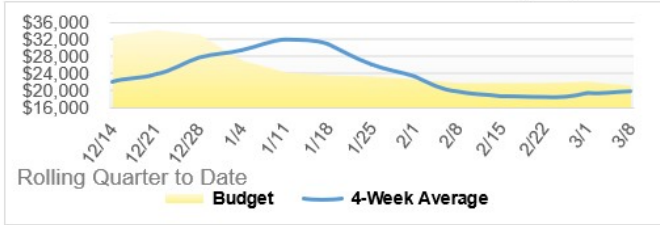

## PASTOR'S PONDEROSA

My Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

*Resurrexit sicut dixit! He has risen as He said!*



On this most glorious day, the Church does not simply recall an event from the past, we proclaim a reality that changes everything. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is not a poetic symbol, nor is it a distant hope. It is a concrete, historical, and eternal victory: life has conquered death, light has overcome darkness, and hope has triumphed over despair.

### What does this mean for us?

It means that nothing, no sin, no suffering, no failure, not even death itself, has the final word. Too often we live as though Good Friday was the end of the story. We carry burdens, fears, anxieties, and wounds as though they define us. But Easter declares otherwise. The empty tomb tells us that Christ has entered into the darkest places of human existence and has transformed them from within. Because He lives, we can live differently.

### And perhaps we need this message now more than ever.

We live in a world that often feels fractured and uncertain, marked by war, political division, violence, and deep unrest. Nations rise against nations. Families are strained. Hearts are heavy. It is easy to become discouraged, to lose sight of hope, or to retreat into indifference. But Easter stands as God's definitive answer to our broken world. The Resurrection is not naïve optimism; it is divine certainty. It reminds us that evil does not have the last word, God does.

### But Easter is not only something to be believed; it is something to be lived.

If Christ is risen, then our lives must reflect that truth. Faith is not meant to remain private or within these church walls; it must take flesh in our daily lives. The Resurrection calls us to be people of hope in a world of despair, people of mercy in a world of judgment, people of peace in a world of conflict. This means returning to the practice of our beautiful Catholic Faith with renewed seriousness and joy. It means coming to Holy Mass not out of obligation, but out of love for the One who gave everything for us. It means frequenting the sacraments, especially Confession, where the power of the Resurrection restores us again and again. It means prayer in our homes, teaching our children the Faith, and living as witnesses to Christ in a world that so desperately needs Him.

### My dear friends, Easter is an invitation.

It is an invitation to begin again. An invitation to hope again. An invitation to believe that God is not finished with you. No matter where you have been, no matter how far away you may feel, the Risen Christ calls you by name. Just as He called Mary Magdalene in the garden, He calls each of us out of our sorrow, out of our confusion, out of our sin, and into new life. Let us not leave Easter behind as a single day. Let us carry it into every day of our lives. Christ is risen, and because He is risen, everything is different.
