About the Assessment

Charisms, or spiritual gifts, are special abilities given to all Christians by the Holy Spirit through baptism. These gifts give us power both to represent Christ and to be a channel of God's goodness for people. Whether extraordinary or ordinary, all charisms ought to be exercised in the service of God (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2003).

Sadly, many of us are not aware of our gifts or abilities. These gifts are then not utilized for the Service of God, and others suffer because of it. We at the Parish of the Holy Eucharist desire our parishioners to become the best disciples of Christ that they can be. Therefore, we are highly encouraging our parishioners to take our Spiritual Gifts Inventory and consider joining a ministry based on their spiritual gifts!

This inventory will give you an introductory evaluation of your gifts and possible ministry categories for you to share your gifts in love of God and neighbor. It can help you pinpoint the best places to begin, but discerning our charisms is a process. If after taking this inventory you would like to further discern your charisms and gifts, consider contacting the parish contact person to learn more about where you might be called.

Instructions

It will take approximately 15 - 20 minutes to take the inventory. There are 126 questions that assess your gifts in 18 different areas. Once you have totaled your scores for each of the gifts using the self-scoring sheet, please use the Top Charism Answer Sheet along with the Charism Descriptions to discern where our parish may be the best served by your charisms.

Read each statement then rate it in terms of how true this is for you, not how you think you should behave or feel. Be as honest as possible. In most cases, your first thought on what the answer should be will be the most accurate.



Administration	A person with this charism excels at planning, organization, and

Craftsmanship	A person with this charism is gifted at making tangible objects by
	hand. This could include using cloth, wood, metal, or paint in the
	making of their objects.
Creativity	A person with this charism is generally artistic, whether in
	writing, art, or music. They embrace their creative nature, think
	outside the box, and are innovative.
Discernment	A person with this charism listens to the movement of the Holy
	Spirit in their own life and the lives of others. They can assist
	others on their faith journey by listening, offering companionship,
	and recognizing the spiritual gifts and strengths of others.
Encouragement	A person with this charism aims to motivate others to live out the
	Catholic Christian Faith. Through support, they strengthen those
	around them as they live out the Faith.

	the Gospel in order to strengthen the Faith of those around them.

Piety	A person with this charism has respect for things pertaining to God and has a strong devotion to and deep love for Jesus Christ truly present in the Blessed Sacrament and to the Blessed Virgin Mary. They actively participate in the Sacramental life of the Catholic Church.
Prophecy	A person with this charism knows what is true and will defend it. They do not shy away from the beliefs and teachings of the Catholic Church, and they urge others to change their behaviors in order to live in right relationship with God.
Service	A person with this charism accomplishes tasks in order to support others. They understand the loving service we are all called to as Christ's disciples and serve others as Christ has commanded us to. They see the value in supporting the Church, the community, and those around them as the hands of Christ on earth.
Teaching	A person with this charism conveys the truths and teachings of the Catholic Church in a way geared to those they are teaching so that all may understand. They communicate effectively and help others apply the Catholic Faith to their lives in order to live it out.

Spiritual Charisms and Ministry Parings

ADMINISTRATION

"Chairing" a Ministry or Committee: Lead one of the Parish's ministries or committees through organization, planning, coordination, and management.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Teach children in the Parish the Catholic Faith at their own level and coordinate volunteers for this ministry. This ministry takes place on Sundays.

Food Drives: Plan, organize, and manage a food drive at one of the Churches. Most food drives take place around major holidays.

Fund Raising: Help the Parish's financial status by devising and executing plans for raising funds.

Pastoral Council: This council is made up of parishioners from each Church who stay up to date on everything happening in the Parish and make helpful suggestions to the pastor when consulted.

Finance Council: This council is made up of parishioners from each Church who help access the Parish's financial status and make helpful suggestions to the pastor when consulted.

Usher: Greet and welcome people at the door of the Church, coordinate the collection and gift bearers, and give out bulletins.

Parish Events: Help the Parish with planning, organizing, and executing events. Events include St. Valentine's Day Ball, Clam Festival, Parish Picnic, Advent Fair, Lessons and Carols, and Christmas Pageant.

Senior Luncheons: Coordinate senior luncheons, including who is bringing food and what they are bringing or help with setting up and cleaning up. This gathering occurs on the third Thursday of the month at Sacred Heart Church.

Volunteer at the Office Front Desk: Help greet and direct visitors and phone calls, and organize schedules at the Parish office.

Eucharistic Adoration Captain: Recruit, coordinate, and organize volunteers for various times of adoration in the Parish.

Vacation Bible Camp: Help prepare and/or lead decorations, activities, snacks, games, and more for the children of the Parish in the summer.

Welcoming New Parishioners: When new parishioners register, send them a "welcome" packet and connect them with the chairs of the activities they are interested in and any necessary staff members.

Wedding Coordinator: Coordinate weddings, including rehearsals and decorations, in the Parish. Serve as a contact person for questions and assistance during the process.

Knights of Columbus: A brotherhood of Catholic men who play a part in improving the world, one community at a time, and who are dedicated to serving God and neighbor.

CRAFTSMANSHIP

Liturgical Environment: Assist in properly decorating the Churches for each Liturgical Season as to bring people to a deeper Faith through their senses.

Altar Linen Care: Assist in properly taking care of the cassocks, linens, and vestments used at Holy Mass. This includes washing, drying, ironing, and folding.

Parish Events: Help the Parish with planning, organizing, and executing events. Events include St. Valentine's Day Ball, Parish Picnic, Advent Fair, Sparkle Parade, and Christmas Pageant.

Volunteering at the Parish Office: Assist with various projects in the Parish office, including planning and execution.

Landscaping: Assist in making our Church grounds beautiful year-round through outdoor work.

Vacation Bible Camp: Help prepare and/or lead decorations, activities, snacks, games, and more for the children of the Parish in the summer.

Sanctuary Candle Making: Assist with making sanctuary candles to burn in our Churches.

CREATIVITY

Choirs and Scholas: Praise God and serve the Parish through singing in our Parish's choirs and scholas.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Catechist: Assist in teaching children ages 3-6 in our Parish through a Montessori style catechesis. Classes meet twice a month on Sundays.

FIRE Catechist: Assist in teaching school-age children in our Parish about God, the Catholic Church, prayer, and more. FIRE stands for Families in Religious Education, which leads every family member to a deeper understanding and Faith. Classes meet monthly on Sundays during the school year.

Graphic Design: Assist in designing images and visuals for the Parish's use in advertising and communications.

Liturgical Environment: Assist in properly decorating the Churches for each Liturgical Season as to bring people to a deeper Faith through their senses.

Livestream: Assist in broadcasting Holy Masses at the Parish. This includes running the video recording system during Holy Mass and editing the videos. Livestreaming and videography for the Parish is especially helpful for our homebound parishioners.

Fund Raising: Help the Parish's financial status by devising and executing plans for raising funds.

Landscaping: Assist in making our Church grounds beautiful year-round through outdoor work.

Photography: Use your creative skill to take photos of our Churches and events for use in communications and advertising.

Pro-Life Ministry: Witness to the sanctity of human life through this ministry, including prayer, events, and support.

Social Media: Contribute to the Parish's social media platforms, including Facebook and YouTube, with videos and images.

Vacation Bible Camp: Help prepare and/or lead decorations, activities, snacks, games, and more for the children of the Parish in the summer.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Teach children in the Parish the Catholic Faith at their own level and coordinate volunteers for this ministry. This ministry takes place on Sundays.

Parish Events: Help the Parish with planning, organizing, and executing events. Events include St. Valentine's Day Ball, Christmas Pageant, Sparkle Parade, Advent Fair, and the Parish Picnic.

Making Music, Praying Twice: A rich and faith-filled program for families that uses music and simple Catholic prayers and concepts to grow in the Faith while having fun.

DISCERNMENT

ACTS Ministry: A ministry for Catholics to grow the parish community and grow in personal devotion through adoration, community, theology, and service.

Small Group Facilitator: Lead a group of parishioners through a book, lesson, or topic, along with discussion and fellowship.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Teach children in the Parish the Catholic Faith at their own level and coordinate volunteers for this ministry. This ministry takes place on Sundays.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Assist the clergy, who are the ordinary ministers of Holy Communion, in distributing Holy Communion to the laity during Holy Mass or bringing Holy Communion to the homebound.

Centering Prayer: Deepen your faith in God's abiding presence through this weekly group that includes prayer, silence, spiritual reading, and discussion.

FIRE Catechist: Assist in teaching school-age children in our Parish about God, the Catholic Church, prayer, and more. FIRE stands for Families in Religious Education, which leads every family member to a deeper understanding and Faith. Classes meet monthly on Sundays during the school year.

Grief Group: Comfort, assist, and strengthen those who are grieving through two meetings each month.

Opus Dei: Join this group that endeavors to help people find God in their everyday lives. This group is a personal Prelature of the Catholic Church.

That Man is You: Join this Men's Faith Formation group, especially for husbands and fathers.

Friends in Faith: Share faith and fellowship with parishioners through this group. This group meets weekly.

St. Monica Club: Join this prayer group for women praying for the conversion of their families.

Centering Prayer: Deepen your faith in God's abiding presence through this weekly group that includes prayer, silence, spiritual reading, and discussion.


