#### LIVING OUT THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL

In the days after the awful 2020 killing of George Floyd, a Catholic friend remarked, "Racism is today's great evil. We should put all our energy into fighting it." I admired her intuition that the church must stand firmly against evil. Amen, I thought. At the same time, something felt wrong. As months went by, I saw her steadily slide into bitterness and anger. Soon, despondency. She spoke of giving up the fight. Don't we too wonder how to fight evil without losing our joy or energy?

Jesus' words this week help. He says, "Rejoice not that you have power over demons, but that your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20). Notice the asymmetry in where he wants our focus: on the latter, not the former. Should we confidently embrace our God-given power to overcome evil? Absolutely. But even more so, we should emphasize the positive element of our relationship to God. It is tempting but dangerous to define ourselves by what we oppose. It is better to define ourselves by--to rejoice in--what we celebrate: in Jesus, God has written our names in heaven. This sustains our battles.

This week, our marching orders are: fight evil. But more deeply, rejoice that God knows and loves us personally, individually. We allow this joyful knowledge to undergird our fight against the darkness of our day. Then we enjoy long-term stability to be cheerful warriors, who never forget the reason for the contests we are called to fight and win: love.

#### **WELCOME FATHER JAMES MARTIN NOBLES!**



Born in Louisiana and raised in Mississippi, God has blessed me with a deep appreciation of how my parents raised me and how my formation equipped me. I had the "typical" Roman Catholic upbringing of saying grace before meals, praying my nighttime prayers, and always attending Sunday mass. As the last of five children, I will never forget my favorite memory from my childhood, Sunday dinner, where seven people would have thirteen conversations. I attribute these Sunday dinners to why the Lord has given me my prominent "preacher voice."

God has blessed me with many pastoral opportunities in just four years of priestly ministry. I served as the parochial vicar at St. Peter Catholic Church, the oldest church in West Tennessee, rector of the National Shrine to St. Martin de Porres, chaplain at the University of Dallas, and now preach for Cross Catholic Outreach, a global catholic ministry offering spiritual and material support to the poorest of the poor. I have come to deeply trust in the providence of God that He will give me the right words. These pastoral opportunities would have gone much differently without my formation as a Dominican friar.

Central to my identity and mission is my Dominican charism. I joined the Order of Preachers in 2014, hoping to find a community that could perfect and form the desires of my heart back toward the Lord. In the Order, we refer to the "holy preaching" as that which is done not at the ambo or in the classroom but that essential preaching spoken among the brothers in truth-filled conversations. For over a decade, I have received this holy preaching from my brothers, which has humbled me and made me a better brother and priest. I have heard the comment from some people that I have a gift for preaching. Yet, I do not think this gift would be possible without the brother's formation and support.

So, while I came from a little corner of the country and a loving home, I continue to entrust my life to God, who calls me to leave behind the familiar and trust in His providence in this sacrament of the present moment. While my ministerial experiences have varied, the mission remains the same: to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ for the salvation of souls. In response to God's love for me and His people, I pray that the desires of my heart may continue to be perfected towards that singular, holy longing for the Lord. As the psalmist says, "As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God" (Psalm 42:1).
