Thirtieth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Reflection for this week

Many years ago, when one of my daughters was just four years old, she took the scissors to her younger sister's hair, clipping the bangs right to the scalp. When I asked her why she cut her sister's hair she replied "I didn't want her to look cuter than me!" Well she got top marks for her honesty!

Have you ever considered how sometimes, we have a hard time loving ourselves? How many times have you caught yourself thinking, if only I were thinner? If only I was taller. If only I was as confident as him. If only I had more money. If only I could loose ten pounds then I would be truly happy. If only, if only, if only! How many times do we criticize ourselves being hard on the body and gifts we have? Why is it that we find it so hard to love ourselves?

In today's Gospel reading, this is exactly what Jesus is asking us to do. In fact, not only does Jesus ask us to love ourselves but to love our neighbour as we love our self. If we do not have love of self, how then can we in turn love others? Without love, what are we? What seems like the simplest of commands is actually pretty hard to carry out.

The Pharisees in today's reading are still trying to take Jesus down using yet another angle to trap him. They think "let's see how well Jesus knows the Law." Jesus however, is not referring to the Law of the Pharisees but the new law of love proclaimed first by the prophets. First love God, and then love your neighbour as yourself. All other commandments are fulfilled if we get this right.

If I love God so completely with my entire being, my capacity for love of others is endless. I see myself as loved by God, and I love myself too. But, to love my neighbour, my friend, or persons who annoy me, no matter what? Well, that can be hard! The message contained in this reading for us, is follow the new law, the way of Jesus, to love with simplicity. Love is everything.

Love of God, a truly sincere love, makes us fearless in our love for others and gives us the capacity to be strong, compassionate, charitable and joyful in our everyday lives. Realizing God is the source of all love and we are nothing without Him, turns us into true Disciples of Christ willing to love others as He loves us!

Everything in our lives hinges on love. How do we perfect this love? With prayer, and participating in the sacraments, in particular, the Eucharist and Reconciliation. Like any skill we wish to perfect, it takes practice.

Well my daughter's hair eventually grew back and her older sister learned to love her just the way she was. Yes, the little sister was really cute with curly red hair but the big sister was very cute also. Both have grown up to be beautiful young women! Of course, I love them both!


