

Weekly Reflection

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time January 30, 2022

The gospel reading for today, Jesus not being accepted in his home town, sure resonates with me.

Many years ago, when I was 48 years old and 50 was looming on the horizon, I decided I needed to make a change in my life and get in shape. I looked in the mirror one day and realized I did not want to look as I looked then, for the rest of my life. Was the change easy? I thought it would be. I was so wrong! The change took effort, lots and lots of effort!

Being a busy mother of ten, finding time for myself was a challenge but I eventually figured it out and after two years of hard work, the results were evident. I could move, especially dance, without getting out of breath., my clothes fit, I had energy, I enjoyed how I ate and I had a positive outlook on life. Still though, there was something missing.

It is to be expected when someone undergoes a great change in their life, that people notice. For example, a great weight loss; people are initially concerned that perhaps you aren't well but then congratulate you on your efforts. They inevitably also want to know how you did it? How did you accomplish such a change. They don't want to hear, well this was hard work, no they are looking for the easy way out, for a simple easy to achieve solution that they too can apply to their own lifestyle.

After my conversion in the Hely Spirit, I know I was alwayed never to be the same again! Remember

After my conversion in the Holy Spirit, I knew I was changed never to be the same again! Remember, I knew something was missing? Well that something was someone; Jesus!

I began attending daily Mass, read scripture every day, listened to praise and worship music, gave up my useless magazine subscriptions, and found JOY in my heart like I had never felt before. I also returned to the sacrament of Reconciliation, spent time reading faith-based books, and I learned life was not about me!

Some people readily accepted the change in me and congratulated me on my new life in the Spirit. Others were suspicious and even turned on me with an attitude of "who do you think you are?" and "aren't you one of us?"

Why is it so hard to share a spiritual encounter? It is not easy to be open about it but this is what we are called to do. We can't keep Jesus and what he does for us a secret. The news is too good! There is too much joy! I had people say to me, I don't know what happened to you but the change is good! Keep up the good work, keep doing what you are doing! There were some people who asked me about my conversion and what that took. Some did not want to hear that as a cradle Catholic, I had discovered Jesus. There were others too, who said "I want what you have" and were open to conversion.

Contrary to popular belief, life with Jesus is not always easy. We are, after all, human. As with any relationship, it takes work and commitment on our part, to keep the relationship alive. There is one thing though that I am certain of, all things are possible with God! Life is so much better with Jesus and I wouldn't want it any other way!

Greetings to West Middlesex Catholic Family of Parishes:

It has been a while since I have done an update on what is happening at 37 Frank Street Youth Centre in Strathroy. For those who do not know us, we are located on Frank Street in Strathroy. We are a division of YFC/Youth Unlimited Strathroy. "Frank's" is a safe place for youth, whether they are in need or not, to come in and simply hang out. We have board games, a small library, free wifi and of course the biggest draw...free food as well as reasonably priced food for purchase.

There have been a few changes in our opening hours to accommodate teens after school. Our daytime hours are Tuesday to Friday 11:00 am to 4:00 pm and we have been able to finally open Frank's Cafe - Tuesday to Thursday evenings from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm.

We have four churches in Strathroy that each take a week and bring us prepared food and groceries for that week. With this food and other donations, we have been able to serve over 1300 meals to the homeless, hurt and hungry in the Strathroy area. Ladies from All Saints CWL have been looking after the second week of the month for us. It has been greatly appreciated.

Last spring I applied to the Pope Francis Fund for a grant to purchase items to help out when we are able to open our emergency shelter. We were approved and now have bed frames, mattresses, bedding and other room accessories ready for use.

This past Christmas we were able to give five families and their children a homemade turkey dinner with all the fixings. We were also able to give their children presents that many would not likely have received for Christmas. One older youth we brought meals and gifts to was so overwhelmed with emotion as we were able to give her something she was never expecting. To see the tears of joy and thanks in her eyes is something all of us will never forget.

"Whatsoever you do to the least of your brothers and sisters, you do unto me,"

Another family with younger children was so happy with the food and gifts to give to their children, they were wondering how they would be able to even provide a gift to each of their children at all. They were so grateful for the kindness extended to them.

We have other stories of youth who have come into our centre who are in need of immediate care. We were able to provide them with emergency backpacks that contain toiletries, gift cards, an emergency sleeping bag, a tent, non perishable food and more. We are also working in close contact with Josh Smith, the Community Navigator for our area. If there is something we cannot assist the youth with, Josh can. He has been an incredible asset to our community. On February 26, 2022, we are holding the CNOY (The Coldest Night of the Year) to raise awareness of homelessness, hurt and poverty in our community. We are also getting teams and walkers to join in a 2 or 5 km virtual walk in Strathroy. Money raised will help assist us at Frank's with the centre operating costs and to continue to help the hurt, homeless and impoverished youth right here in Strathroy-Caradoc. We need your help as homelessness and hunger is a big issue right here in our community.

This is where all of you come in....Please consider starting a team, joining a team or donating to someone that is walking for 37 Frank Youth Centre. You can go to https://cnoy.org/location/strathroy or give me an email and/or call and I can guide you through this process.
