
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

Weekly Reflection

Reflection for Palm Sunday, April 2, 2023

Today's Second Reading took me back to my days of learning at St. Peter's Seminary!

While attending the seminary to obtain a Certificate in Pastoral Ministry, all of us students would gather in the chapel to pray evening prayer, "Liturgy of the Hours", together. One of my favorite hymns sung at evening prayer was "Though in the Form of God" a hymn based on Paul to the Philippians 2.6-11. This is the scripture for Palm Sunday's Second Reading.

Today is Palm Sunday otherwise known as Passion Sunday. How interesting this Sunday has two names, but it is appropriately named. We begin the liturgy with palms greeting Jesus on his entry into Jerusalem upon a donkey being hailed with "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" The reading of the Passion follows where Jesus is ridiculed, tortured and nailed to a tree to be crucified.

In the second reading, Paul is writing to the Philippians explaining who Christ Jesus was. Paul tells us Jesus had equal status with God but didn't think so much of himself that he had to cling to the advantages of that status no matter what. Not at all. When the time came, he set aside the privileges of deity and took on the status of a slave, and became human! Having become human, he stayed human. It was an incredibly humbling process. He didn't claim special privileges. Instead, he lived a selfless, obedient life and then died a selfless, obedient death - and the worst kind of death at that: a crucifixion. Because of that obedience, God lifted him high and honored him far beyond anyone or anything, ever, so that all created beings in heaven and on earth - even those long ago dead and buried - will bow in worship before this Jesus Christ, and call out in praise that he is the Master of all, to the glorious honor of God the Father.

This reading from Paul, in between the Palm and the Passion, reflects on both the Palm Sunday liturgy and the Good Friday liturgy. The evening office of the Liturgy of the Hours, traditionally have always reflected on the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus making the canticle "Though in the Form of God" a perfect companion to the prayer.

As Lent draws to a close, remember you are not looking out for your own interests but of those of others. In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Jesus Christ and humble yourself. Therefore, continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose. If you get a chance, look up the hymn, "Though in the Form of God" in the CBW #687 or listen to it on You Tube. Enjoy!








My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine



floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.

Going to Mass on Sunday to receive Holy Communion certainly disposes our hearts as Jesus asked. Jesus wants us to come to Him! He wants to give us "complete forgiveness of sins and punishment"! What a gift!

Please join us as we pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet together at the 3 o'clock hour. As this is outdoors, please dress accordingly for the weather, bring your rosaries and your lawn chairs, blankets for warmth. There will be light refreshments and fellowship following prayers.
