#### Now I See and Believe



Daniel Kish is a man who lives a very active life. He rides mountain bikes and hikes alone in the wilderness. He travels around the globe. He's a skilled cook, an avid swimmer, a graceful dancer. Daniel Kish is also very much blind. But he doesn't let that stop him from living independently. He uses a technique called echolocation – much like a bat – to sense his surrounds, by clicking his tongue and then listening to the reverberations resounding off the objects and terrain around him. Kish may not have sight, but in most of the ways that matter, he can very much see in ways that those with sight cannot.

In today's Gospel, the blind man, unlike Kish, is given actual, physical sight, but by the grace of God and Christ's actions in his life, he (like Kish) can now see so much more – he can recognize what the Pharisees, who are born with sight cannot, that Jesus is the Son of God, the Messiah.

As Pope Francis notes, the blind man's life receives "illumination" on two levels, "a physical level and a spiritual level: the blind person first receives the sight of the eyes and then is led to faith in the 'Son of Man', that is, in Jesus. It is all a journey... He takes a route that leads him to gradually discover the identity of the One who opened his eyes and to confess his faith in him... He is no longer a beggar marginalized by the community; he is no longer a slave to blindness and prejudice. His path of enlightenment is a metaphor for the path of liberation from sin to which we are called...The healed blind man, who now sees both with the eyes of the body and with those of the soul, is the image of every baptized person... But it is not enough to receive the light, one must become light. Each one of us is called to receive the divine light and manifest it with our whole life."

Like the blind man of the Gospel, each of us, by the grace of the Holy Spirit can come and know Jesus in our lives if we truly look for him and seek him out, if we are willing to call out to him and ask for his mercy and blessings on our lives. Or, like the Pharisees, we can choose to be purposely blind to God's presence in the world, ignoring his call to us, rejecting our need for repentance and forgiveness, choosing to stumble along the path of worldly desires our secular society claims to be the "real" path to "happiness" in life.

What do you and I seek from God? What do we seek from God in our prayers each day? Health, happiness, safety, security? These are all good and right things to seek from God. But do we also seek to know him, to truly see him in our lives and world, to recognize him in those around us, to be given the vision to know his will for us and the path he desires us to take?

"Who is the Son of Man that I might know him?" asks the blind man of Jesus. That is a question each of us asks in our own way as we seek to know and encounter Jesus more deeply each day in our lives. What does he mean to us and how do we see him in the world – in the face of the poor, in the precious gift of the unborn child, in the value and dignity of the frail and the elderly, in the foreigner seeking safety in our midst? We must open our eyes to see and know Jesus anew each day. Like the blind man, it is a process that does not happen immediately and at once, but gradually and over time, so that our lives might truly proclaim, "I have seen him and I do believe."

#### Symbols and Signs of the Liturgy

#### The Reproaches

The traditional chant to be sung during the Adoration of the Cross on Good Friday is known as *The Reproaches*. It has been sung during the Good Friday liturgy since at least the ninth century, even though in most parishes today it is regrettably ignored, (as are most of the ancient traditional chants provided in the Roman Missal.) The text speaks for itself as a chilling statement of the injustice of the Crucifixion. Our Lord says to us from the Cross: *My people, what have I done to you? Or how have I grieved you? Answer me! Because I led you out of the land of Egypt, you have prepared a Cross for your Savior. Because I led you out through the desert forty years and fed you with manna and brought you into a land of plenty, you have prepared a Cross for your Savior. What more should I have done for you and have not done? Indeed, I planted you as my most beautiful chosen vine and you have turned very bitter for me, for in my thirst you gave me vinegar to drink and with a lance you pierced your Savior's side. The only possible response from us is repeated throughout: Holy and Immortal One, have mercy on us.*



### Lent - February 22nd through April 1st

#### **GUIDELINES FOR FASTING AND ABSTINENCE**

Lenten fast and abstinence regulations for the Diocese of Worcester are as follows:

- Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) years of age and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics who are eighteen (18) years of age but not yet fifty nine (59) years of age on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- ♦ Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed Lenten penitential practices.
