- Morning Offering reciting this prayer every morning when we first wake up, offering Jesus our prayers, works, joys and sufferings throughout the day for our own ongoing conversion and the conversion of others to Christ.
- <u>First Friday Devotion</u> including Mass, receiving Holy Communion and reciting an Act of Reparation.
- <u>Daily Mass</u> attendance and receiving Holy Communion.
- Spending <u>Personal Quiet Time with Jesus</u> present in the Holy Eucharist reserved in the Tabernacle, praying for the Intentions of Pope Francis and for all those in need.
- Taking short <u>"Prayer Breaks"</u> with Jesus during the day.
